ABSTRACT

1. After 30 years of implementing a school feeding programme in Sao Tome and Principe, WFP is preparing to transition its school feeding programme to the Government. This follows the establishment of a National School Feeding and Health Programme with WFP's advocacy and support in 2010, and the National Assembly's approval of a school feeding and health policy in February 2011.

- 2. A decentralized evaluation of WFP's ongoing school feeding activities and an internal evaluation of the Government's capacities have highlighted that significant progress is still needed in three main areas: i) funding, ii) implementation and monitoring, and iii) accountability, in order to ensure a successful transfer of responsibilities to the Government.
- 3. This development project will focus on supporting the development of the Government's capacity to successfully manage a national school feeding programme while phasing the transfer of responsibilities for providing a daily hot meal to 43,200 schoolchildren from WFP's school feeding programme.
- 4. The timeline for the transition has been established in consultation with the Government, with an annual review of activities and milestones to expedite timely adjustments and remedial actions as needed.
- 5. The project is aligned to the country's new United Nations Development Assistance Framework (2012–2016) and WFP Strategic Objectives 4 and 5. It will contribute to achievement of Millennium Development Goals 2 and 3.
