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

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BACKGROUND

1. This is the second annual report on the implementation status of actions by Headquarters divisions, regional bureaux and country offices in response to evaluation recommendations. It covers the recommendations arising from evaluation reports presented to the Board in 2008, 2009 and 2010.

METHOD

- 2. To ensure consistent and systematic follow-up to evaluation recommendations, the actions and deadlines shown in the management response matrixes are entered into a database maintained by the Performance and Accountability Management Division (RMP). As deadlines approach, RMP asks divisional directors to provide written updates on progress; these are reviewed for accuracy and recorded in the database.
- 3. In cases where there has been no action, the following steps may be taken:
 - > a revised implementation date is agreed;
 - > senior managers are made aware of the lack of progress; or
 - > as a last resort, the RMP Director seeks prompt action from the manager concerned.
- 4. This report uses the following categories:
 - implemented: action completed by 31 December 2010;
 - > outstanding: action not yet initiated, or initiated but not complete by 31 December 2010; and
 - ➤ not applicable: action not implemented because of changes in the operating environment or other reasons.
- 5. Unlike its predecessor WFP/EB.A/2010/7-F, which considered only actions that were to be implemented by 31 December 2009, this paper provides a status update for all agreed actions regardless of the initial deadline. The aim is to achieve more accurate and complete reporting.

SUMMARY OF RESULTS

- 6. Since 2008, the Secretariat has presented management response matrices to the Board with the evaluation reports: 32 evaluation reports were presented with management responses during 2008–2010.¹
- 7. Table 1 shows that of the evaluations presented to the Board with management responses 59 percent concerned operations, 25 percent were strategic evaluations and 13 percent were country portfolio evaluations. One impact evaluation was presented to the Board in 2008–2010.



- 8. The findings on implementation status are as follows:
 - There were 303 recommendations made in the 32 evaluation reports; the Secretariat agreed to carry out 427 actions to address them.
 - ➤ Of the 427 actions, 338 were to be implemented by 31 December 2010.
 - ➤ By 31 December 2010, 259 of the 427 agreed actions 61 percent had been implemented; 33 percent remained outstanding and 6 percent were deemed not applicable (see Figure 1 and Annex).
 - ➤ Of the outstanding actions, 40 percent had an implementation deadline later than 31 December 2010; the main reason for delay in completing the remaining 60 percent was that implementation timelines were unrealistic.

Figure 1: Implementation Status of Agreed Actions, 31 December 2010




9. Table 2 shows the implementation of actions by evaluation type: 66 percent of the actions related to strategic evaluations and 60 percent of those related to operation evaluations were completed, compared with 54 percent for country portfolio evaluations and 50 percent for impact evaluations.

10. Figure 2 shows the progress made during 2010 in implementing the actions reported in WFP/EB.A/2010/7-F. Of the 216 actions that the Secretariat had agreed to carry out in response to the 17 evaluations presented to the Board in 2008–2009, 38 percent had been implemented by the end of 2009 and 71 percent by the end of 2010. There were 62 actions – 29 percent – outstanding at the end of 2010.
