ABSTRACT

Many of Malawi's small and marginal farmers are becoming steadily poorer and progressively more at risk because of drought and crop failure, hence increasingly food-insecure. As successfully demonstrated through the 1995/96 emergency operation (EMOP), food for work (FFW) can help to mitigate food insecurity through short-term employment opportunities with food as a wage component or incentive for self-help activities, at the same time producing outputs capable of reducing the longer-term food insecurity of the rural poor. Experience in the country confirms that vulnerable women are eager to undertake such activities, which employ a high percentage of households headed by women and generate longer-term development benefits. A total of 35,000 beneficiaries will participate in FFW activities. Women will comprise 70 percent of the target group and will be the main longterm beneficiaries of the assets created. The vulnerability analysis and mapping system will be a tool for project targeting. WFP will also collaborate in practical ways with donors as well as projects and initiatives within the United Nations system.
