
The Mission of the African Risk Capacity (ARC)

The ARC is a Specialized Agency of the African Union (AU) designed to:

- improve current responses to drought food security emergencies and
- build capacity within AU member states to manage drought risks

As an African-owned, continental, early response mechanism, ARC offers an African solution to one of the continent's most pressing challenges.





ARC Agency and ARC Ltd

- ARC Specialized Agency is the cooperative mechanism for:
 - Overseeing the entire ARC operation
 - planning development
 - providing capacity building to individual countries
 - approving contingency plans and monitoring their implementation
- ARC Ltd will be the mechanism for actually carrying out the quasi-commercial insurance functions of risk pooling and transfer.

ARC Agency and ARC Ltd

ARC Agency oversees the establishment of ARC Ltd, but once established ARC Ltd will function independently


ARC Agency

- ARC Agency Secretariat will work with members to establish Contingency Plans




- REQUESTED the Commission in collaboration with ARC Secretariat to elaborate a legal agreement for the establishment of the African Risk Capacity (ARC)

- REQUESTED the Commission to convene a meeting of government experts and subsequently a conference of plenipotentiaries before the end of the year to consider and adopt the establishment agreement"
