- Regular dialogue among the RBA Principals/ Senior Management

- Endorsement of the <u>Framework for Action for Addressing</u> <u>Food Insecurity in Protracted Crises</u>




Latest on RBA initiatives



Operational Collaboration

- In 2014, RBAs collaborated on 21 projects in 18 countries;
- Main areas: joint assessments, food assistance technical assistance and capacity building initiatives, coordination of the joint clusters
- RBA collaboration accounts for >20% of WFP's UN collaborations;
- New joint Programming in Laos, Kenya, and Niger
- National plans for reaching Zero Hunger in pilot countries;
- Moving into a Post P4P Pilot Phase;
- Joint resilience initiatives
- RBA guidance material developed for WFP staff
