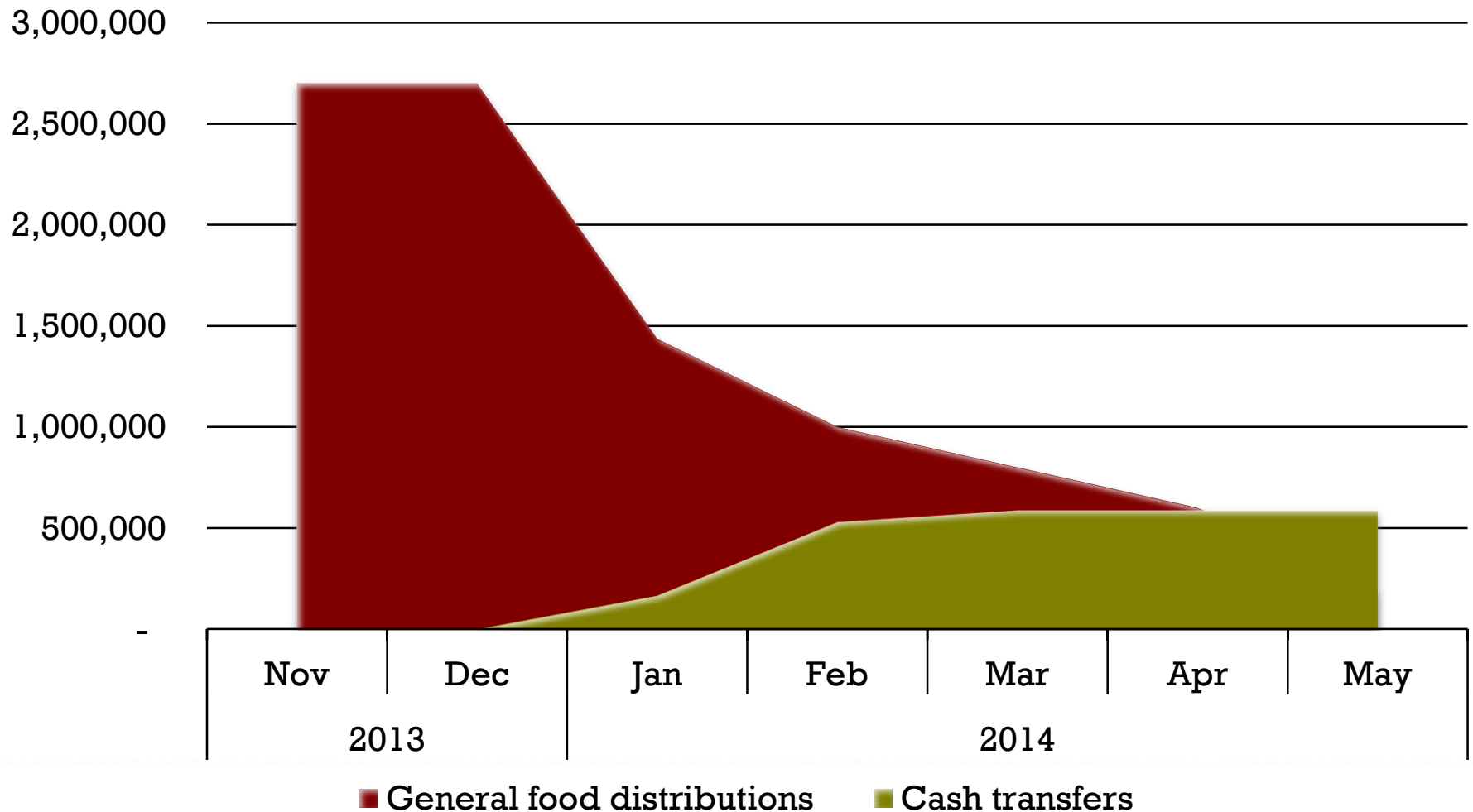

- Infrastructure rehabilitation





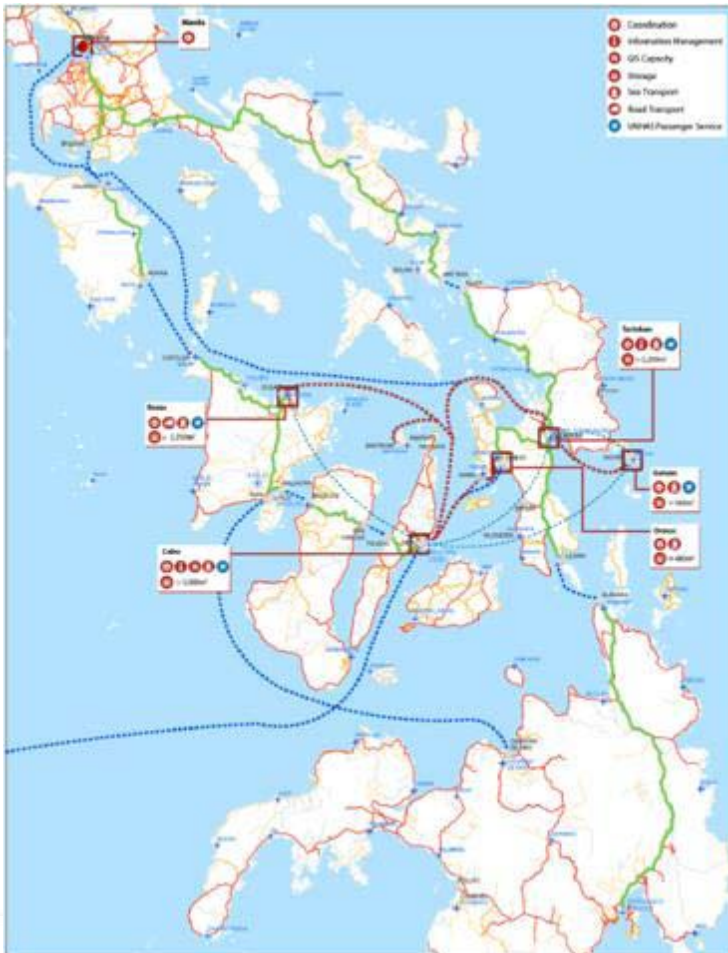

ETC services are now being provided in 31 locations across nine towns and cities.

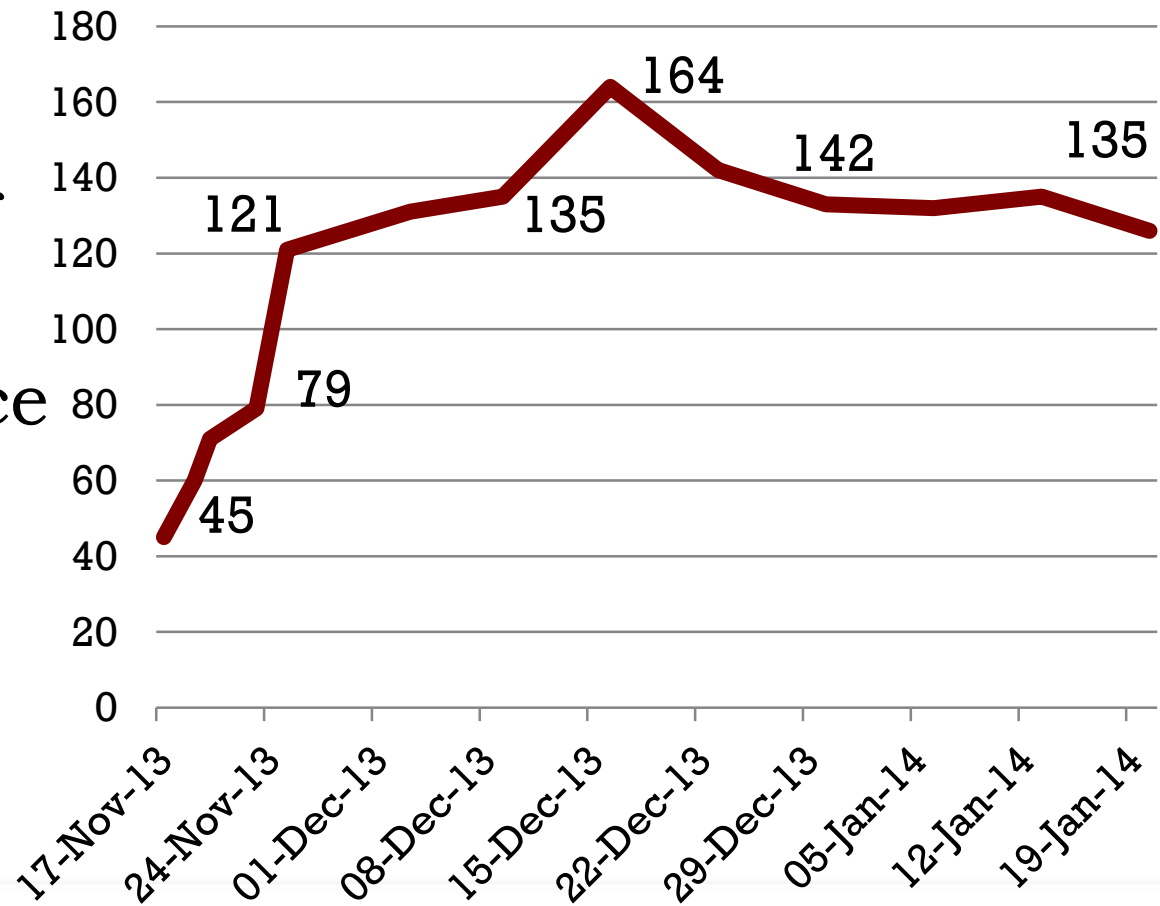
Voice communication, internet connectivity, radio communication, IT Help desk, printing facilities





Human Resources Staff deployment

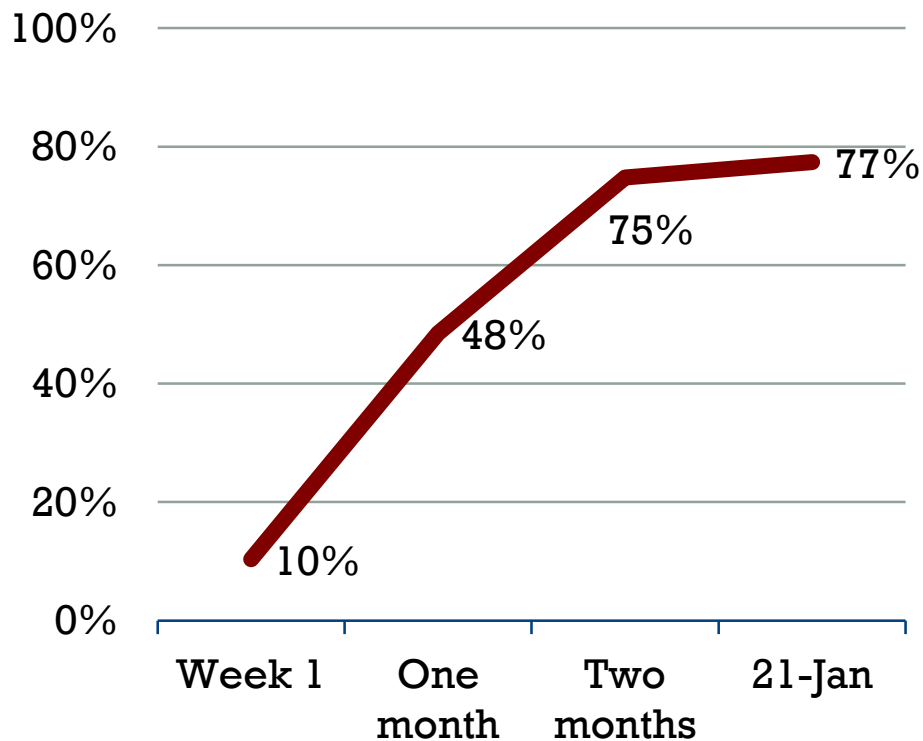
Immediate deployment of the right staff helped advance our response



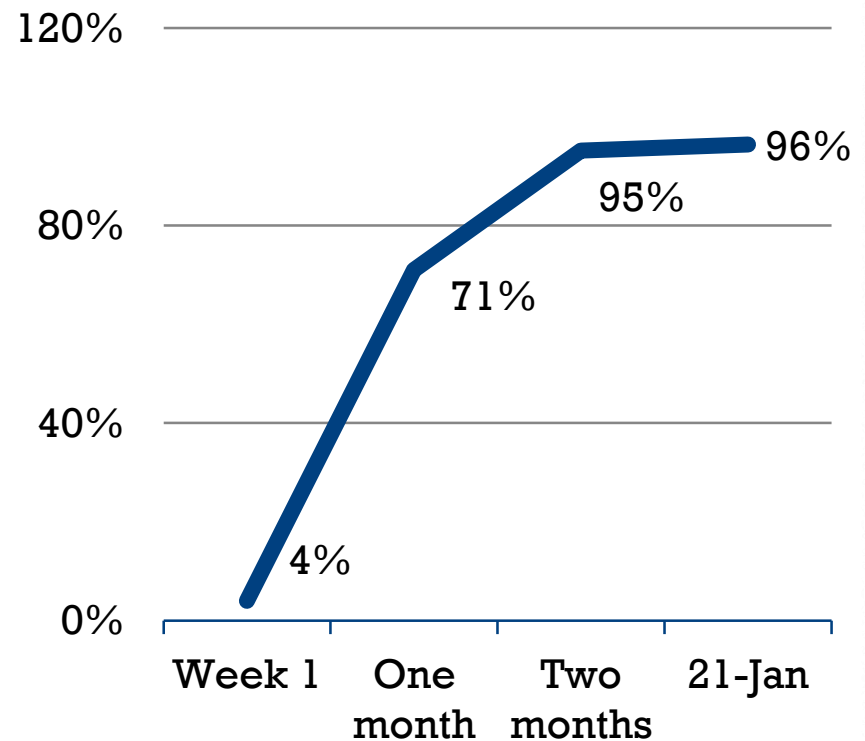


Resourcing: Timeline
