

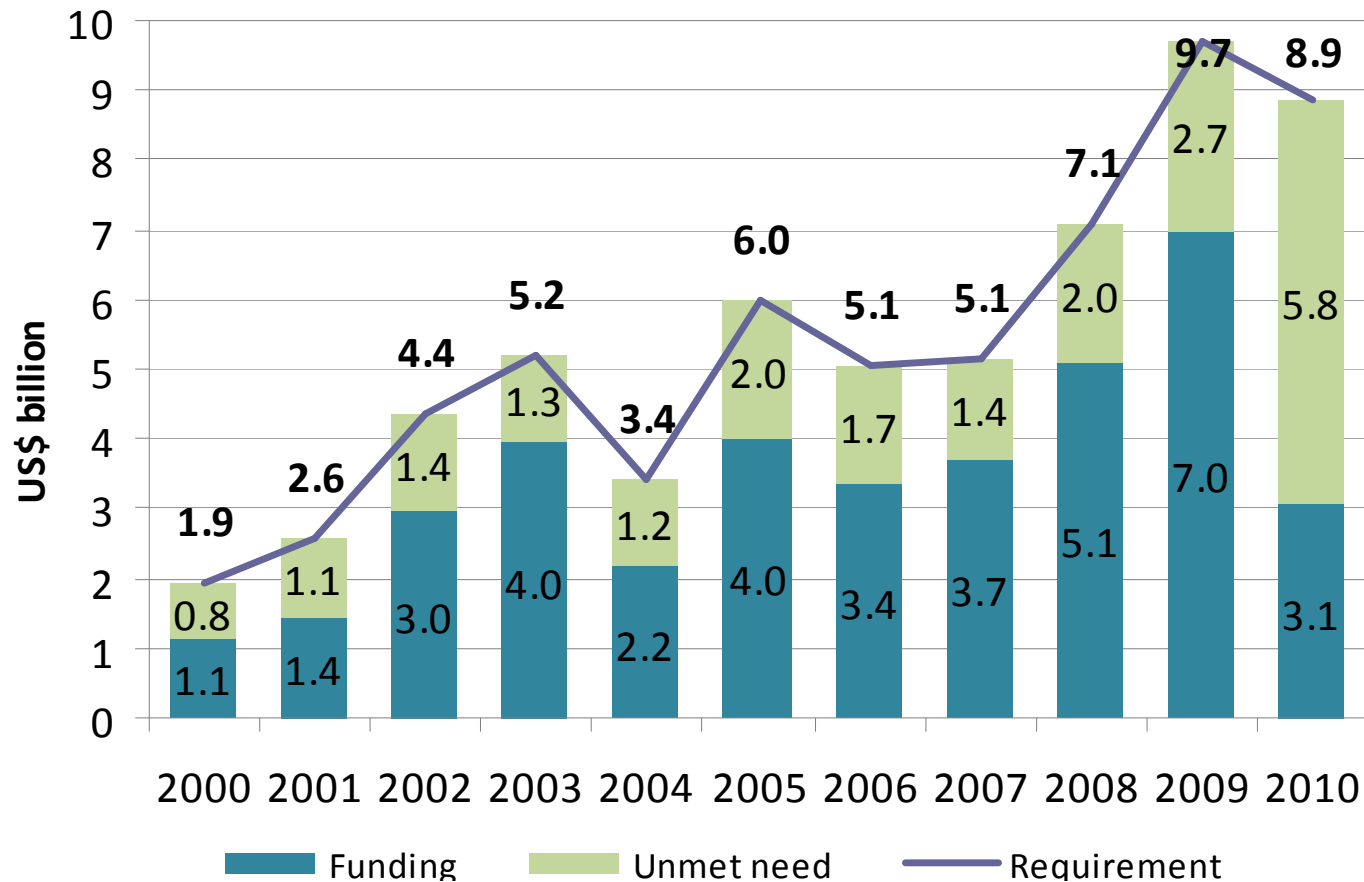

A “donor” perspective

1. Why have humanitarian budgets?

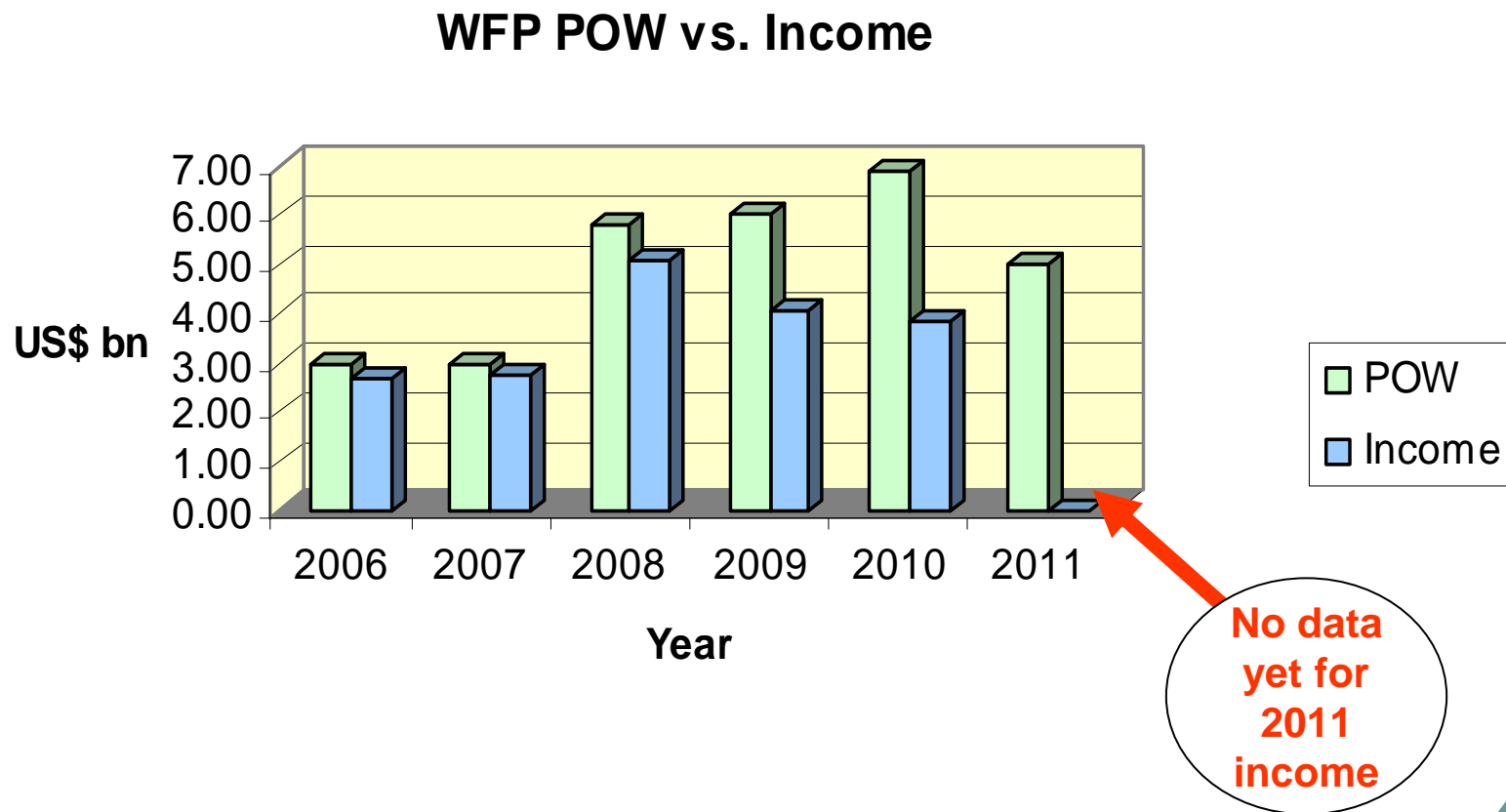
Humanitarian aid to save lives, alleviate suffering and maintain and protect human dignity during and in the aftermath of emergencies	Development aid to promote long term sustainable development
Used according to humanitarian principles (neutrality, impartiality, neutrality and independence)	Used according to Paris/Accra principles (harmonization, government ownership, etc)
Has lighter appraisal criteria based on immediate needs assessments	Has more detailed appraisal criteria within a broader cooperation framework (national plans, UNDAF, One UN etc.)
Has faster initial disbursement and time-expedient exemptions from normal competitive processes (e.g. calls for proposals, tenders etc)	Has slower initial disbursement and use of normal competitive processes.
Is programmed shorter-term (often single transfer).	Is programmed longer-term (often scheduled multiple transfers over 3-5 years)

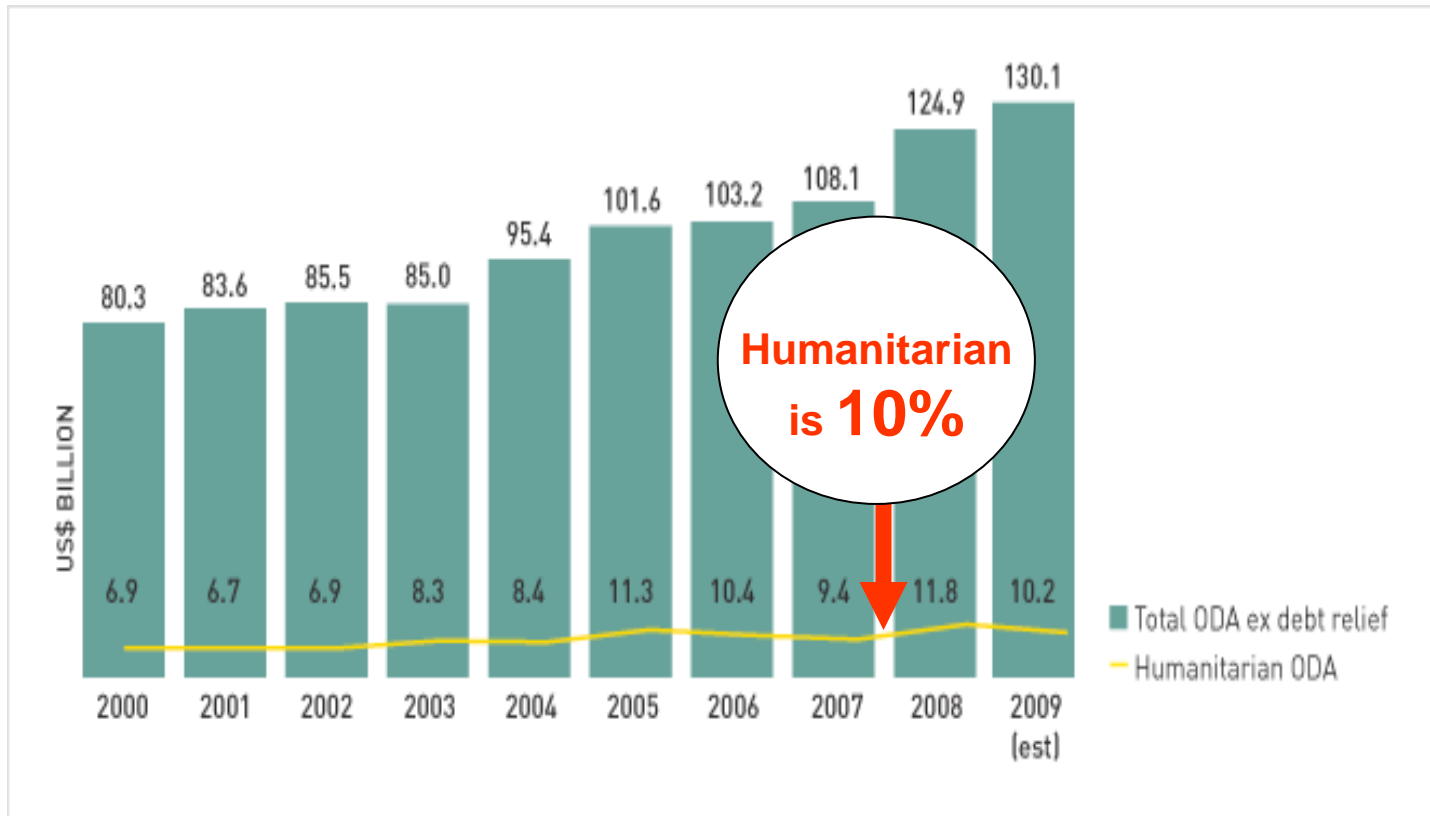
