Increased needs

In the period from 2006 to 2009:

- Value of approved projects in OMB increased from US\$490 million to US\$1.5 billion.
- Quantity of food delivered increased from 1 million tons to 1.8 million tons.
- Number of beneficiaries increased from 18 million to a current level of 42 million people.

Increased needs

In April 2009, the ESCAP report entitled "Sustainable Agriculture and Food Security in Asia and the Pacific" quotes:

- "for 583 million people across Asia and the Pacific, the financial crisis has become a food crisis"
- Asia-Pacific is home to **62 percent of the world's** undernourished.

Increased costs


High Food Prices

- In Afghanistan, the average price of wheat flour in urban markets is still as much as 50 percent higher compared to prices two years ago.
- In **Pakistan**, **wheat prices** over the past two years have **increased by 93 percent**.
- In **Thailand** the price of **rice** remains **85 percent** higher than in 2005.
- Transport costs generally worsening security situations contributed to higher internal transport costs.

Security: High risk environments

- Of the 14 countries in the Asia region only Cambodia and Laos are without a UN Security Phase.
- We are at Phase III in Afghanistan, parts of Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Nepal and Mindanao in the Philippines.

Paki stan



<u>Pakistan</u>

- In May distributed monthly rations to about 2.6 million IDP's.
- Multiple registrations: no distributions in the early days of June during validation of IDP registrations.
- Current EMOP caseload of 1.5 million IDPs with a resource requirement of \$170 million. To date \$72 million has been received with secure pledges for a further \$55 million.
- Budget Revision to reflect about 2.5 million and to increase the resource requirement to some \$280 million.

Sri Lanka



Sri Lanka

- Over 290,000 IDPs are now in some 40 temporary transit centers:
 - Vavuniya 270,000 Manik Farm
 - Jaffna, Trincomalee, Mannar
- Improved access congestion relocation.
- Aim: to resettle IDPs within 180 days.
- Likely outcome: unable to be resettled until the next harvest in April / May 2010.
- Pipeline Shortfalls: USD 35 million is needed to maintain food distributions to IDPs to the end of 2009.

Afghani stan



<u>Afghanistan</u>

- 2008: 250,000 tons of food to 8.6 million beneficiaries in all 34 provinces.
- Activities: drought and high food prices; school feeding; combat TB, worm infections and anemia; community health and nutrition education.
- Jan April 2009: 80,000 tons of food distributed.
- 'UN no-go areas" Assessment Monitoring.
- In established Areas and Sub-Offices expanding our M&E.

School Feeding

- 34 million school-age children out of school.
- 2008: WFP Asia had school feeding in all 14 countries, providing 11 million children with school meals and 3.7 million children with take home rations.
- 2009: the School Feeding Project in Laos was selected as a model for "good practice" based on strong community participation and ownership and alignment with national policy.

Innovation

- Advance Procurement of Rice.
- Nutrition:
 - Fortified Blended Food Factories
 - Ready-to-Use-Food (RUSF)
 - Albion Street Clinic in Australia; REACH initiative in Laos; Plan International cooperation
- AEPR: Simulation Software for Emergency Preparedness and Response (Microsoft)








