




**Percentage Increase in Prices 2004-2007** (Sample Price Increases from WFP Procurement Database)

## V. PROMOTING SOUTH-SOUTH & TRIANGULAR PARTNERSHIPS

MEXICO: Coordinating with Plan Puebla-Panama (PPP) support to prevention of natural disasters, via EPR activities, and human and sustainable development, in support of the Initiative Towards the Eradication of Child Under-nutrition in Central America and Dominican Republic.

NICARAGUA, HONDURAS, & GUATEMALA: CENABAST conducting a logistics and procurement assessment mission jointly with WFP countries to evaluate the supply chain & logistics of their main nutritional programmes.

CHILE May, '08: Regional Technical Conference jointly between WFP and the government of Chile in the framework of the Regional Meeting of Ministers of Social Protection of the Organization of American States (OAS).

#### XVII IBEROAMERICAN SUMMIT ON SOCIAL COHESION (NOV'07)

Through what is known as the Plan of Action, The Heads of State committed to, "Strengthen Iberoamerican collaboration -- within the framework of the commitments of the Monterrey Consensus on financing development, the Initiative against Hunger and Poverty, and the search for innovative financing mechanisms – based on concrete proposals such as "Towards the Eradication of Child Chronic Undernutrition", particularly addressing children under five and pregnant and lactating women. In this context we approve the program 'Human Milk Banks Network' (BLH).


