

(Latin America: poverty rates and per capita GDP, 1980 – 2006)




Since 1980 average GDP per capita increase of 17% - poverty rates still at 1980's level

(Under Nutrition in Central America Compared with Global Trends)






Latin America (11 countries): Undernutrition among children under 5 years of age, by ethnicity (*Percentages*)


