## WFP YEMEN OPERATION

- October 2017: Reached over 7 million food insecure people with general food assistance
- Tripled assistance and doubled number of beneficiaries reached since January 2017
- Due to a lack of resources, only half of WFP's 7 million beneficiaries receive a full entitlement while others receive a reduced entitlement of 60 percent
- Implementing a CMAM scale up for providing specialized nutritious foods to 1.83 million people: 990,000 children under 5 and 840,000 pregnant and nursing women
- Resuming emergency school feeding activities





### YEMEN BLOCKADE

- 05 November, the Saudi-led Coalition released a statement on the temporary blockade of Yemen
- 14 days later first UNHAS flight to Aden
- 20 days later first UNHAS flight arrives in Sana'a
- 21 days later first WFP chartered vessel berthed in Saleef port





#### RESTRICTIONS ON YEMEN ACCESS WILL ONLY WORSEN THE DIRE FOOD SECURITY SITUATION AT HAND:

- Cholera outbreak
- Currently, one-third of the population are considered severely food insecure
- 1.1 million acutely malnourished pregnant and lactating women
- 1.8 million acutely malnourished children and 0.4 million with severe acute malnutrition (SAM)
- Sharing of entitlements and some rotating of beneficiaries





## IMPACT OF BLOCKADE

- Disruptions to commercial fuel and food supplies
- Delays in arrival of WFP food stocks
- Likely reduced entitlements for all targeted WFP beneficiaries in December
- Severely food insecure projected to increase from 6.8 million in 2018: the blockade could further increase food insecure populations
- Also face serious access constraints in non-GoY controlled areas
- Local food purchases cancelled
- Increase in food prices by 15%.
  Diesel by 99% and petrol 71%\*

## MOVING FORWARD

- 2018, WFP targeted beneficiary figures are likely to increase
- With a current monthly beneficiary figure of 7 million people, **USD 278 million** is needed for next 6 months
- Working with all parties to remove access constraints while appealing for political support to end conflict
- Risk of jeopardizing significant gains made
