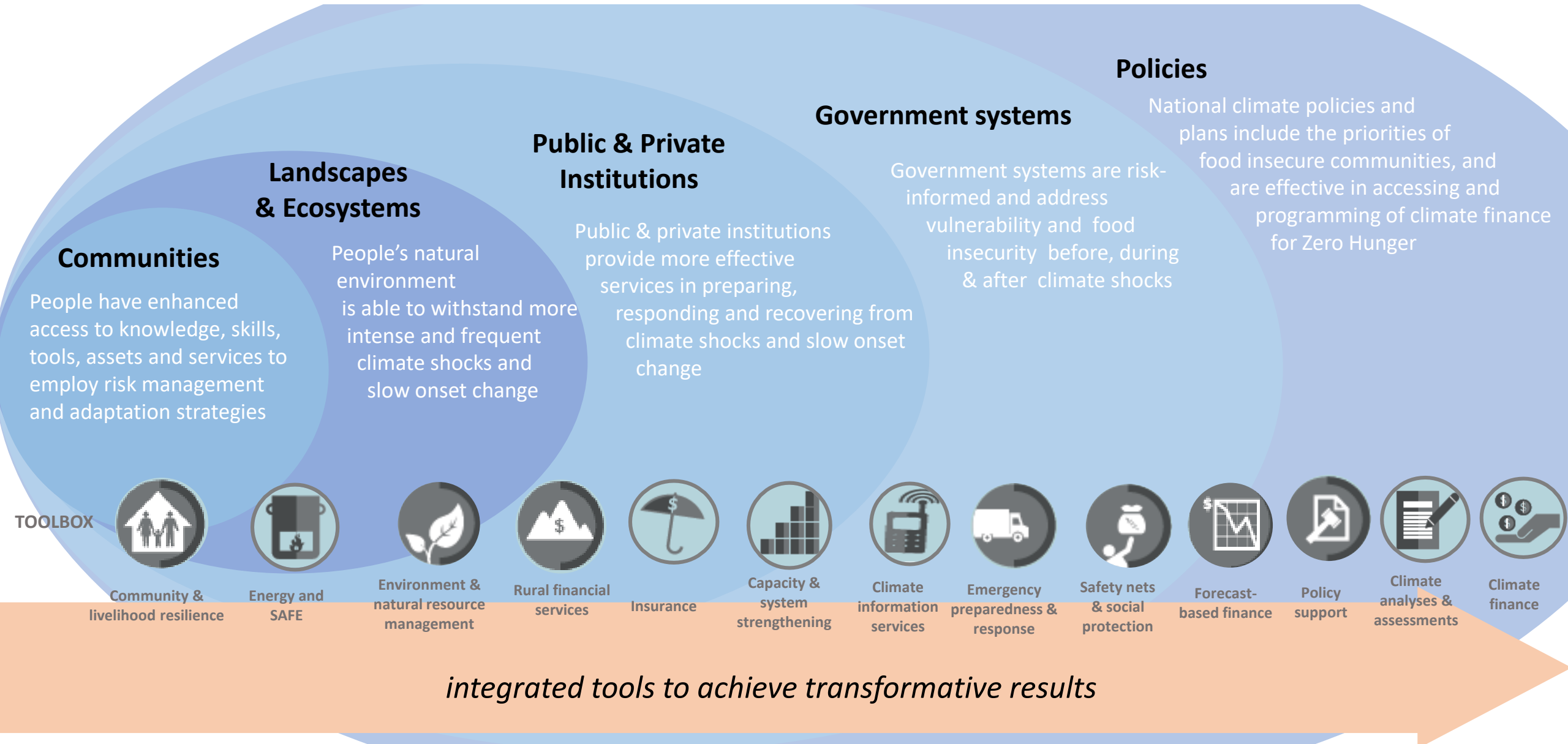

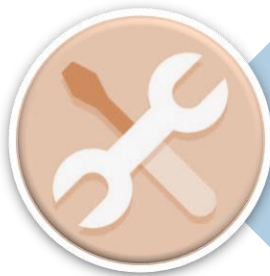
# WFP's Climate Change Policy Implementation Plan

# Pillar A: Capacity Development

## I. Guidance & information products

- **Launch** of climate and DRR programme guidance in WFP Manuals (697 views to date)
- **5 guidance notes** developed to support COs on CSP design, GCF, insurance, energy
- **Launch of WFP online Community** on Climate and DRR to connect with 8000 staff globally

## II. Training & awareness-raising among WFP staff

- **128** WFP programme staff trained on climate issues through technical exchanges
- **46** WFP managers and senior field staff received detailed briefings on climate change and climate finance
- **90** WFP staff attended awareness-raising sessions on climate issues

## III. Synergies with emergency preparedness and response

- Climate dimension integrated into Emergency Preparedness and Response Policy
- Integration of FoodSecure and Forecast-based Financing programmes

## IV. Technical expertise globally & regionally

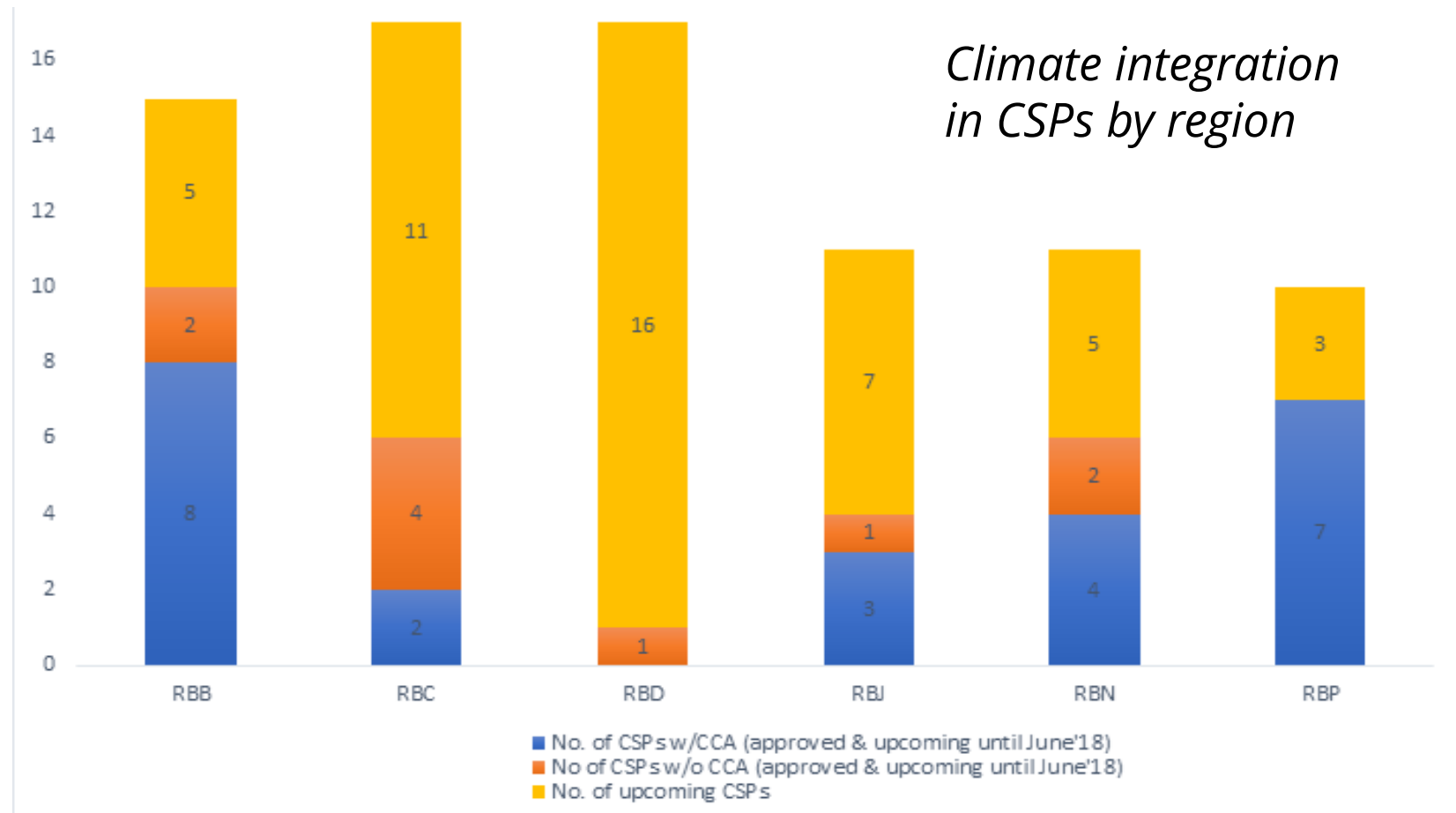
- 7 Long-Term and partnership agreements available with external technical partners
- 3 HQ climate experts out-posted to 3 regions
- 250 climate, DRR and environmental experts screened and included in a technical roster

## I. Technical support to Country Strategic Plans (CSPs)

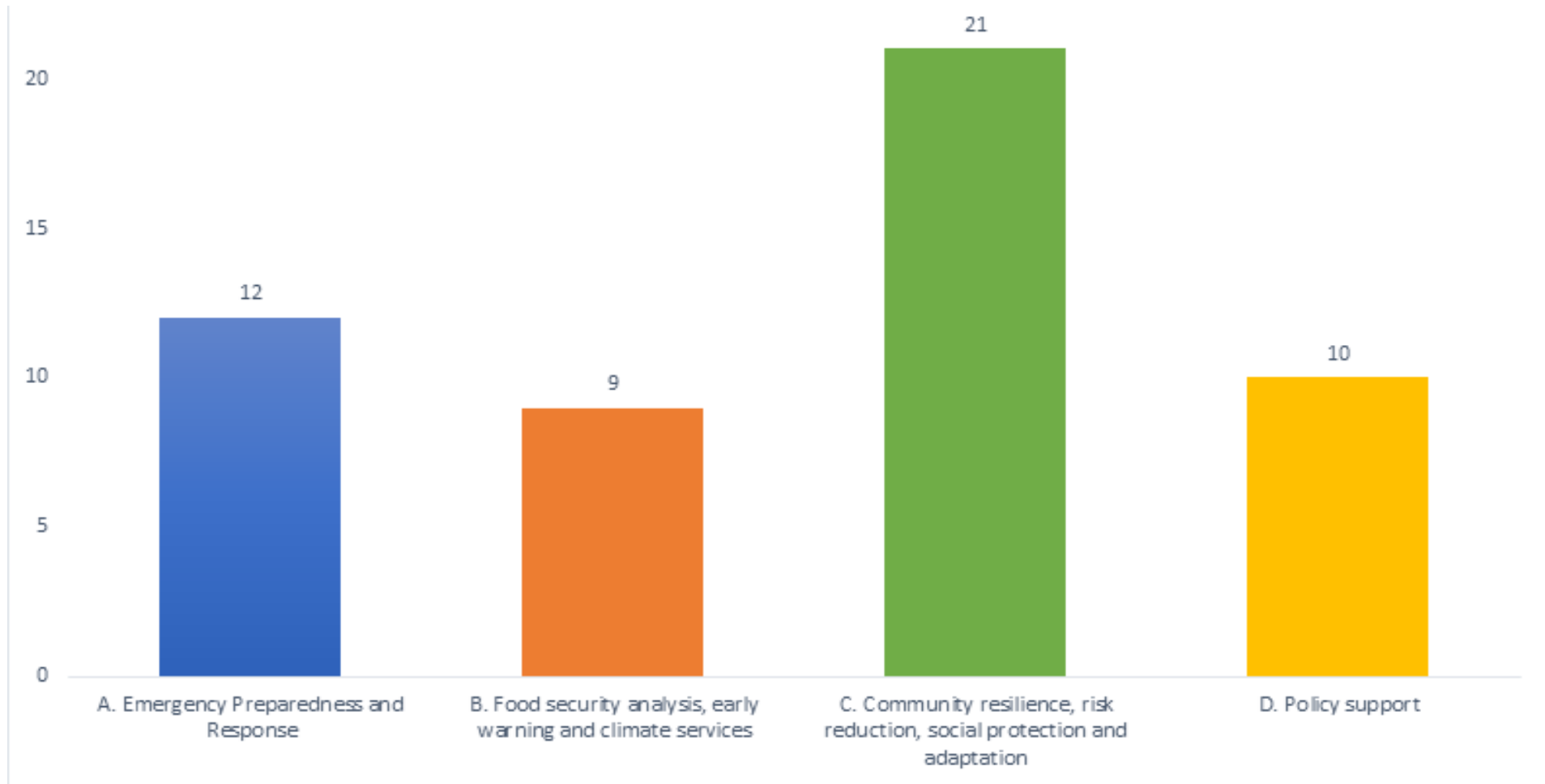
**24 out of 34 finalized CSPs** include climate-related interventions

# Pillar B: Policy & Programme Support To Governments

## II. Supporting governments and COs with climate finance

- \$63.6 million mobilised from multilateral climate funds in 7 countries (53 million AF, 10 million GCF)
- WFP is the first RBA which has successfully supported a country to mobilize GCF funding
- 20 governments have requested WFP support to design GCF-funded projects for climate adaptation

## III. Sharing tools and best practices with governments and other partners

- 17 knowledge products (fact sheets, reports, videos, infographics) shared through 6 Knowledge Management Platforms (WEAdapt, UNFCCC CapDev, HELIX, WFO, ReliefWeb, UNFCCC Clearinghouse)

## IV. Partnerships and RBA collaboration

- New partnerships with Ministries of Environment, insurance and microfinance institutions
- Joint RBA initiatives at country level (through RBA Resilience Framework, R4, IFAD/WFP Weather Risk Management Facility)
- Collaboration on Knowledge products (State of Food Insecurity in the World 2018 climate focus)

## V. International policy advocacy & support

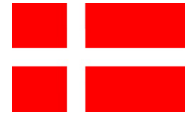
- WFP Representation at UNFCCC COP23, with 11 side-events
- WFP Representation at the 5<sup>th</sup> Global Platform for Disaster Risk Reduction, with 2 side-events



# Pillar C: Scaling Up Innovations

## I. Seed funded grants supporting innovation around climate policy gaps

- ARC Replica (USD 7.7 million committed in 2017)



## II. Scaling up climate risk management and finance innovations

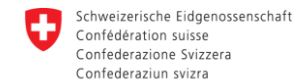
**Rural Resilience initiative (R4)** • **USD 33.7 million** in bilateral funding committed in 2017

- 6 countries supported since 2012



**FoodSECuRE & Forecast-Based Finance (FbF)**

- **USD 4 million** in bilateral funding mobilised since 2017
- 9 countries supported since 2015



**Climate analyses & climate services**

- **USD 2.5 million** in bilateral funding mobilised since 2017
- 19 countries supported since 2011



**SAFE/energy and cook stoves**

- USD 0 million in bilateral funding mobilised since 2017
- 18 countries supported since 2009



# Climate Change Policy Implementation Plan: Funding Status

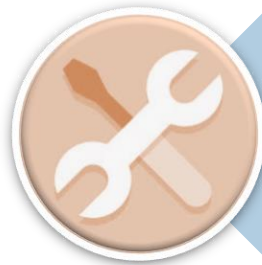
- Resources for climate innovation platforms (Pillar 3) are the main resource to help implement WFP's climate change policy
