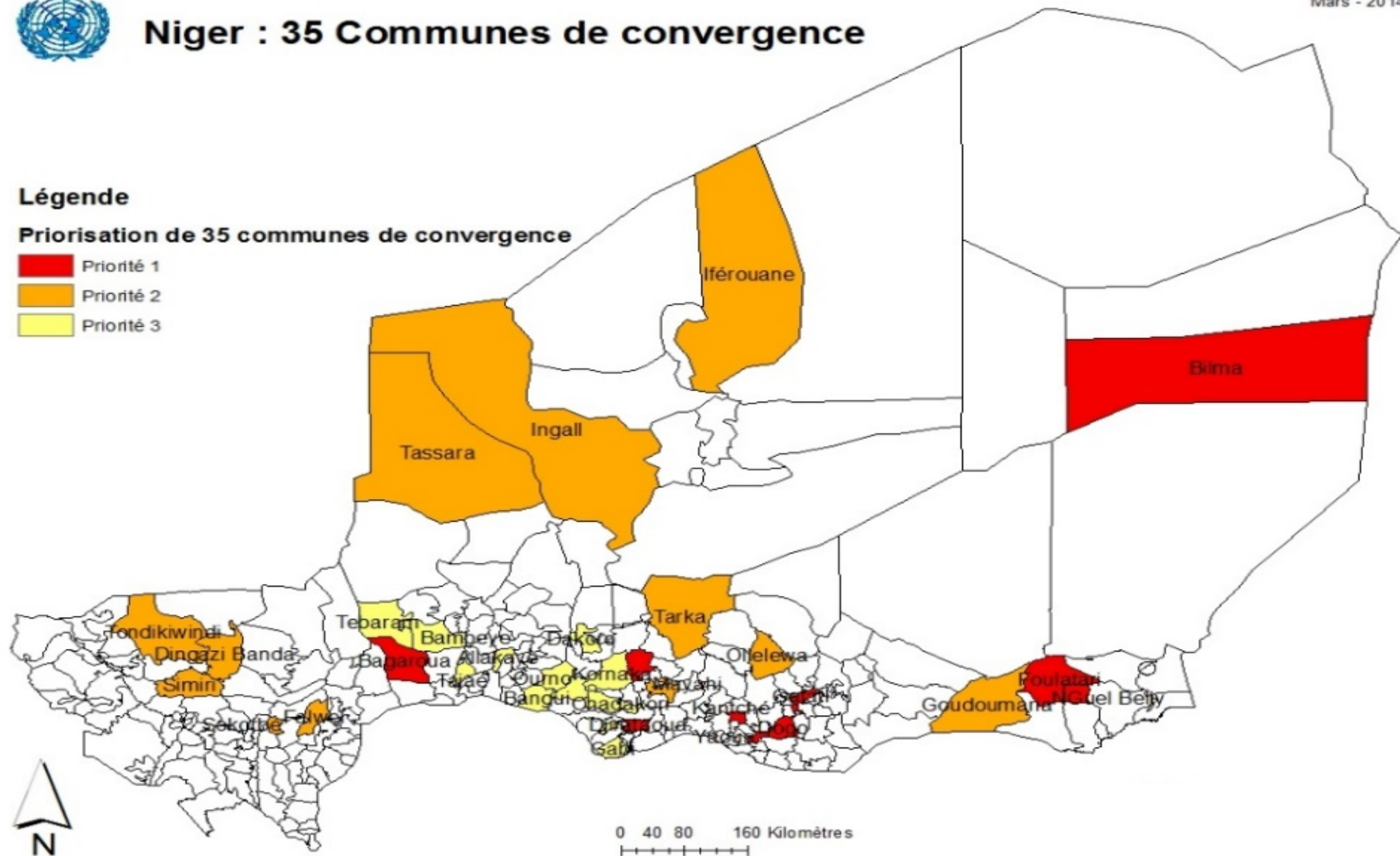


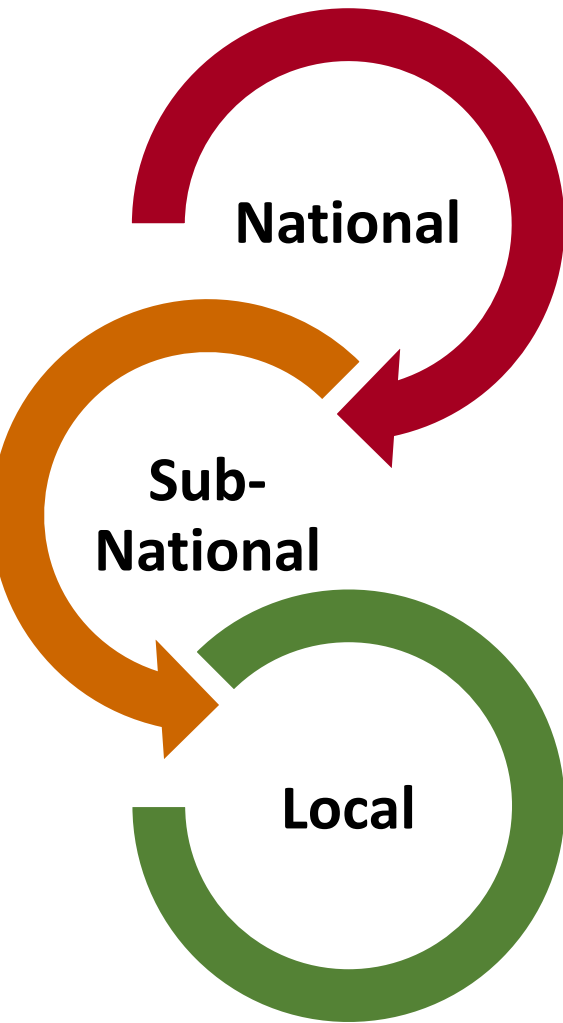
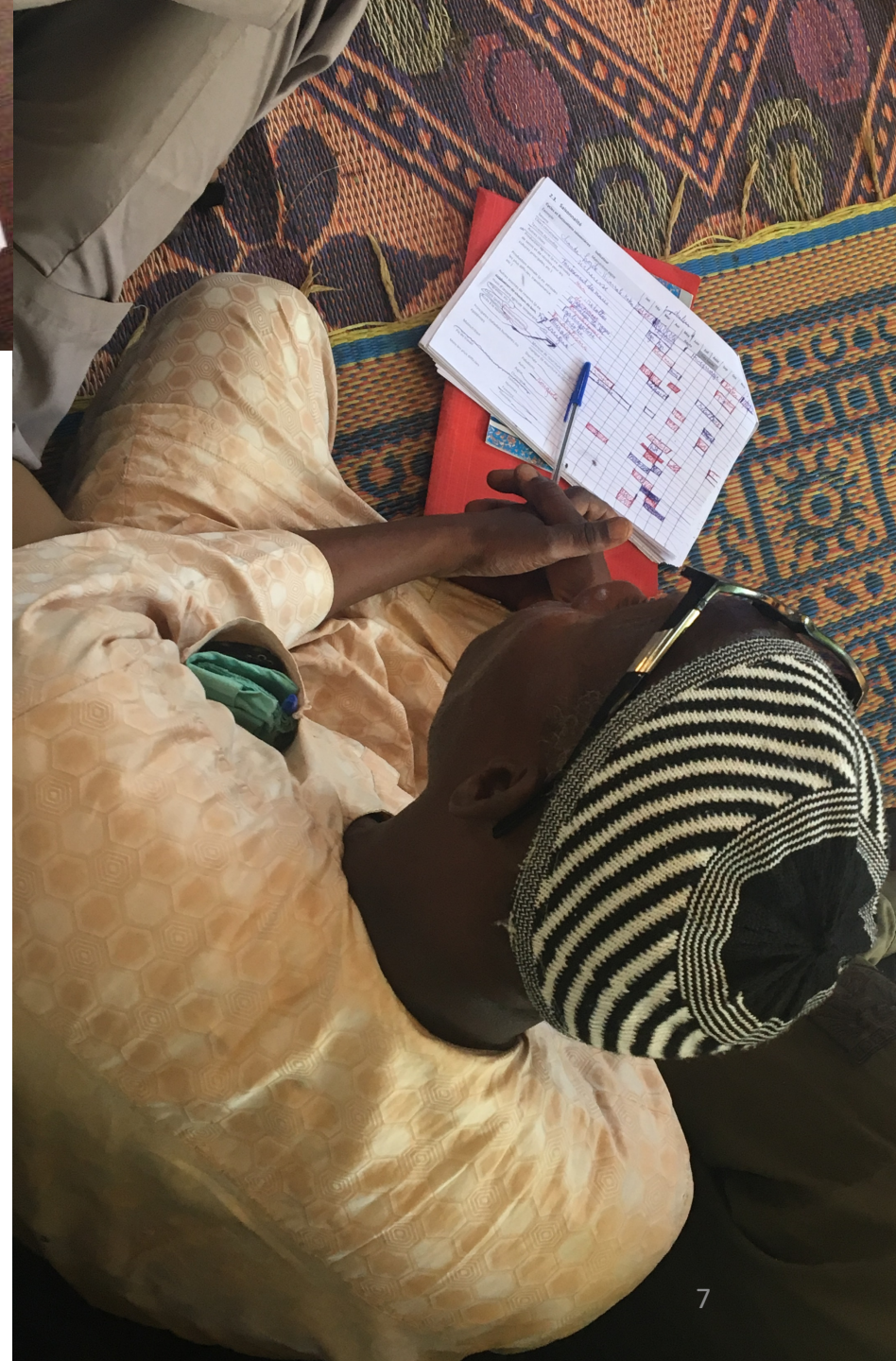
Niger : 35 Communes de convergence

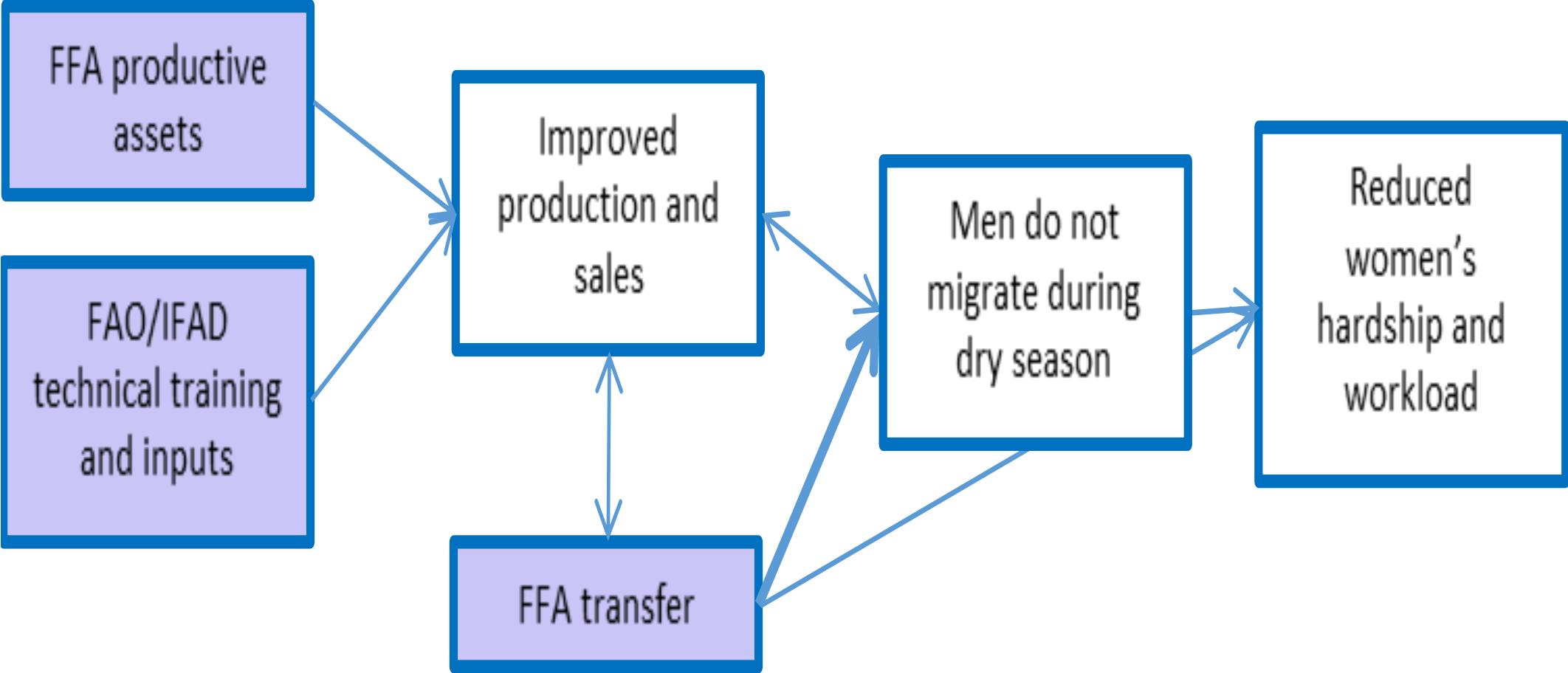
