

# What is Twinning?

Twinning is defined as matching an in-kind contribution from a specific donor with a cash contribution from another donor to cover associated costs and achieve full cost recovery.





# What are the Benefits of Twinning?








- 1 Opening up new partnerships and allowing WFP to broaden its donor base;
- 2 Increasing the availability of food and resources to WFP operations;
- 3 Leveraging food contributions from host governments.



# **Total Twinning Value by Year**

#### TWINNING ARRANGEMENTS



The volume of twinning partnerships reached a **historic high** in **2012**.




# **Recipient Countries**



Since 2004, **62 recipient countries** received **2.2 million tons** of in-kind food through **\$1.2 billion** in twinning partnerships



### **In-Kind Donors**



Since 2004, **47 governments** provided WFP with **2.2 million tons** of in-kind food commodities valued at **\$667 million** 



### **Cash Donors**




Since 2004, 55 governments and funds invested \$489 million in twinning arrangements through WFP



### **Twinning with Host Governments**

#### Arrangements to find cash can be labour intensive





# **Twinning with Host Governments**

- 1. Is mutually beneficial: Food from the Government, for its People, with help from its Friends.
- 2. Shows the government's commitment to its own people, and ownership of humanitarian programmes;
- 3. Gives the host government a "seat at the table" of donors;
- 4. Opens the door to stronger partnerships, strengthening ties with WFP and cash donors;
- 5. Is a way of efficiently utilising and distributing food.





# **Twinning – the Way Forward**

- 1. Twinning will remain an important element in WFP's attempts to broaden its donor base;
- Twinning will continue fostering partnerships, involving host governments and private sector entities;
- 3. Twinning has a particular potential for WFP's cooperation with host governments.
