# Update on the Policy & Theory of Change

## Addressing Vulnerability to Inequality & Discrimination

1. Addressing Needs includes Protection – not only material needs
2. Protection is dynamic in nature & requires continual context analysis through:
  - Quality programming incorporating Participation from the outset
  - Evidenced based results
  - Strategic Direction



# Linkages with Cross Cutting Themes

## Stronger Context Analysis

1. Informed by protection landscape:
  - Engaging with people we are serving
  - Conflict sensitive interventions
  - Inclusion of marginalised and vulnerable groups
2. Nexus – central to protection
  - Longer term objectives
  - Resilience and development
