

Acute hunger




The number of acutely food insecure people in the world could increase by 80% from149 million in 2019 to 270 million before the end of 2020.

121 million people will fall into **acute hunger** in 2020 due to the **impact of COVID-19**.







WFP's IMMEDIATE COVID-19 RESPONSE – Global Response Plan



WFP is appealing for **USD 4.9 billion across 83 operations** to target **38 million additional beneficiaries**.



This represents **62%** of the total budget through end 2020, including an **additional USD 1.7 billion** in scale-up requirements (94% dedicated to crisis response).

- 21,217 Passengers supported to 65 destinations
- 65,989 m³ of cargo transported to 167 countries
 - **338** organizations supported through WFP Common Services
 - 40 MEDEVACS completed
