

- No change on crosscutting indicators
- Some programmatic indicators amended to include references to data disaggregation by sex
- Indicators to be formulated following the Gender Policy

- Slight revision of the indicator on nutrition sensitive packages for clarity
- Additional indicator to measure WFP's effectiveness in meeting diverse nutritional needs across both nutrition specific and nutrition sensitive programmes

#### **Key updates since Second Informal Consultation on the CRF**

- **60 total indicators** (16 KPIs from CRF 2017-2021)

- MR5: New indicators on knowledge management, evidence and data disaggregation
