(*SF Decentralized Evaluation, FNG and COHA studies, Climate Adaptation Response Analysis, Government and partner consultations*)

Four programmatic shifts in the 2G CSP

HGSF is better linked to local **value chain**; **nutrition** is mainstreamed; **crisis response** and **resilience** are integrated

Improve **integration and synergy** across programmes

Mainstream **climate change adaptation**

2.

National capacity on **early warning** is strengthened; **rural communities are more resilient** to climate change impacts

Support the **national social protection system**

3.

Strengthen **transversal issues across interventions**

4.

Disability inclusion, gender equality and women empowerment, environmental sustainability aspects are streamlined

National partners are provided with **capacity strengthening and technical support** to build a nutrition-sensitive and shock-responsive **social protection system**
