Management Response

R1: Continue investing in preparedness for future shocks

- 4.7 million people in need of humanitarian assistance.
- 15% of the population face acute food insecurity.
- Investing in preparedness for future shocks is our top priority.
- Our risk management system has been reinforced.
- Need to manage risks transferred to cooperating partners.
- Partnership cycle have been strengthened.
- Capacity building of partners on humanitarian principles, PSEA and communication with communities ongoing.

R2: Promote triple nexus approach

- Operationalization of the triple nexus.
- Food insecurity, lack of livelihoods and competition over scarce resources are drivers of conflict in Burkina Faso.
- Ongoing efforts to make WFP's programming more conflict-sensitive.
- Research by IFPRI shows how WFP's interventions are strengthening social cohesion in the region.
- With the support of the World Bank, we are investing in national systems and institutions.

R3: Invest in partnerships and localization

- Need for synergic partnerships to improve coherence and effectiveness in our response.
- WFP, FAO, IFAD and UNICEF working alongside to contribute to Government's owned flagship programme "One meal a day".
- Rome-based agencies joint forces under the SD3C project.
- UNICEF and WFP will launch a joint social protection project in 2024, funded by BMZ.

R4: Further community engagement efforts and gender and inclusion focus

- WFP places accountability of affected populations at the centre of our operations.
- We ensure communities have the information and channels to exercise their right to feedback and accountability.
- Our goal is for all our programmes to be gender transformative.

R5: Increase use of data, evidence and analysis for decision-making

- Integrated Context Analysis planned for the coming weeks.
- Historical trend analyses of food security and natural shocks will be used to identify the most vulnerable areas and most appropriate programmatic strategies.
- An Urban Vulnerability Analysis will inform our response in urban areas with high concentration of displaced people.
- Monitoring findings committee has been established.

R6: Invest in human resources to facilitate implementation at scale

- WFP Burkina Faso will conduct an organizational review to match the ambition of our operations.
- Duty of care towards our employees is a priority.
- A Wellness Committee has already been established.
