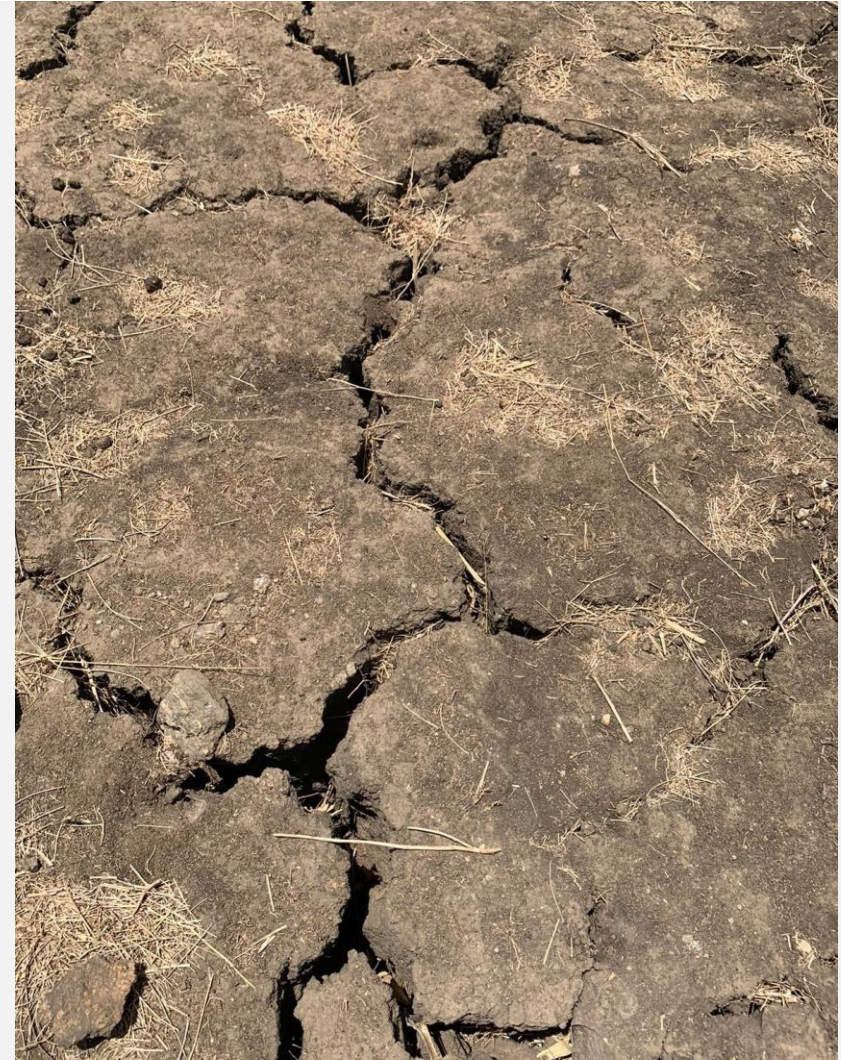
Mission purpose and itinerary

- Focus on integrated resilience projects in view of update of WFP's resilience policy
- Visited six resilience sites
- Engaged with various stakeholders
- Logistical challenges: 47° harmattan heat wave and Chad presidential election



Country and programmatic context

- 2,1 Mio. people in IPC3+, at least one in three children malnourished
- Host to more than 972.000 refugees from neighbouring countries + 250.000 IDPs
- One of the most vulnerable countries to climate change
