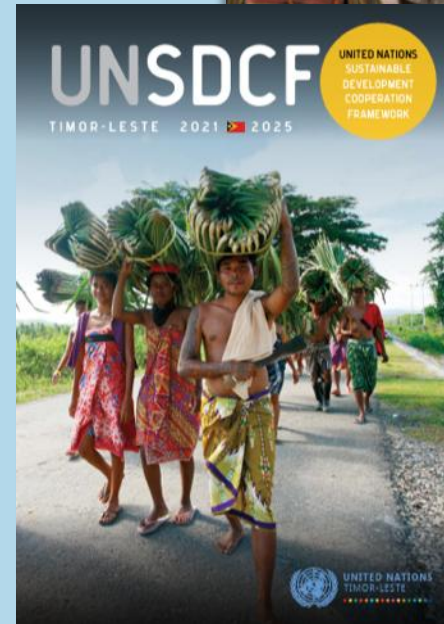
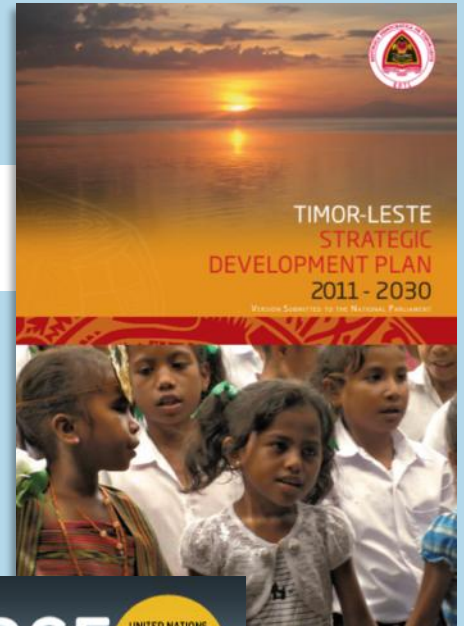
WFP's Comparative Advantages
