Insight 1: Strategic positioning

- Strengthened WFP strategic positioning in food security & emergency response.
- Flexibility allowed alignment with government priorities but gaps in addressing some target groups.
- Subnational interventions created opportunities for longer-term country capacity strengthening (CCS) engagement.



- Despite limited resources, WFP contributed to the improvement of Indonesia's food security data systems.
- Capacity of national architecture for disaster management strengthened.
- Anticipatory action models built at sub-national level including local co-ordination mechanisms.

Insight 3: Challenges

- Not all needed skills available.
- Uneven spending across activities.
- Equity & inclusion embedded in WFP programme designs, but limited measurement of gender in government uptake.
- Challenging to capture effects of CCS in Indonesia.

Recommendations

Remain strategically focused on CCS.

Ensure the collection of **required expertise** to implement a CCS CSP.

Develop a coherent partnership agenda to manage partnerships.

Ensure that the CSP activities are aligned with government processes.

Invest further in **contextualizing** existing corporate systems & results frameworks.
