Insight 1: Strategic positioning

- A **strong evidence base underpinned the relevance** of all CSP components
 - though not all interventions in most food-insecure areas
- **Funding availability shaped strategic focus**
- WFP has positioned itself as a **strong partner to national institutions** (school feeding, crisis response, rice fortification & food security monitoring)
- **CSP aligned well with national strategies & adapted to evolving needs**
- **Weaknesses in the intervention logic & insufficient integration** constrained potential results



Insight 2: Results

- School feeding **increased enrolment and retention** among girls – but transition to national ownership ambitious
- Emergency food assistance for refugees & vulnerable communities **delivered food security benefits**
- WFP supported initial steps towards **establishing national rice fortification capacities**
- Resilience activities **improved women's access to resources**



Insight 3: Challenges

- **Underfunding** hindered scale, continuity & coherence in emergency response, nutrition, resilience and capacity-strengthening efforts
- **COVID-19 disruptions** limited effects of school feeding on learning continuity & household food security
- **Market challenges & limited value chain partnerships** constrained resilience-building efforts

Recommendations

1

Refocus WFP interventions on the most food-insecure areas; reinforce operational synergies across programme components.

2

Improve national capacity strengthening through targeted & participatory strategies, especially school feeding, nutrition and resilience.

3

Build multi-sectoral partnerships with national institutions and UN agencies to address systemic challenges including resilience & crisis management.

4

Redefine WFP's value addition & strategy for impact in resilience, including scaling up national capacity strengthening.

5

Strengthen resource mobilization analysis & set realistic, multi-year funding targets for the next CSP.

6

Improve monitoring & evaluation systems, especially for measuring capacity strengthening results.
