A/RES/66/9	Ongoing	Emergency humanitarian assistance for the rehabilitation and reconstruction of Belize, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua and Panama	WFP provided assistance to vulnerable populations affected by Tropical Depression 12-E, which struck in October 2010, through protracted relief and recovery operation (PRRO) 200043 "Assistance to Vulnerable Groups Affected by Natural Disasters and Other Shocks in Guatemala, Honduras, El Salvador and Nicaragua"; the operation continued in 2011 and 2012. PRROs are WFP's main platform for addressing natural disasters and food insecurity through food assistance, including food for assets and food for training during the early recovery phase. PRROs also provide a framework for emergency preparedness and response, and disaster risk-reduction activities.
A/RES/66/117	Ongoing	Safety and security of humanitarian personnel and protection of United Nations personnel	As reported in the annual WFP Security Report to the Executive Board.
A/RES/66/118	Ongoing	Assistance to the Palestinian people	In 2011 and 2012, WFP continued to provide food assistance to the Palestinian people through PRRO 200037 "Targeted Food Assistance to Support Destitute and Marginalized Groups and Enhance Livelihoods in the West Bank" and emergency operation 200298 "Emergency Food Assistance to the Non-Refugee Population in the Gaza Strip".
A/RES/66/119	Ongoing	Strengthening of the coordination of emergency humanitarian assistance of the United Nations	As reported in the WFP Annual Report for 2012 to ECOSOC and the FAO Council.
A/RES/66/120	Ongoing	Strengthening humanitarian assistance, emergency relief and rehabilitation in response to the severe drought in the Horn of Africa region	In July 2011, WFP expanded its operations to provide direct food assistance to 9.5 million people affected by drought and conflict in the Horn of Africa. WFP is providing a lifeline to vulnerable Somalis in Ethiopia, Kenya and Somalia. In Somalia, WFP provided 1.5 million people with life-saving food assistance. WFP assisted Somali people in Ethiopia while supporting Sudanese refugees fleeing conflict in Blue Nile State. Food assistance and life-saving nutritional support are currently being provided to 574,000 refugees in Kenya and 342,000 refugees in Ethiopia.

A/RES/66/158	Ongoing	The right to food	<p>WFP continued to support the right to food and country-led efforts to adopt right-to-food approaches in line with its Strategic Plan (2008–2013) and the Millennium Development Goals. WFP's humanitarian and development food assistance reached 99.1 million people in 2011, with specific attention given to gender equality and empowerment. As a result of resource shortfalls however, WFP was required to prioritize its responses.</p> <p>Major interventions included: i) joint WFP/FAO crop and food supply assessment missions and emergency food needs assessments to obtain information on food security and food assistance needs; and ii) supporting country-led efforts to develop sustainable food-security frameworks and effective food-assistance responses for people whose right to food was not being realized.</p> <p>Continued emphasis was given to capacity development support for national governments. WFP developed a national capacity index to measure progress towards nationally owned hunger solutions against five quality standards. The index has already been used in Armenia, Cape Verde and Tajikistan to establish baseline values.</p>

(E/2011/19)	Ongoing	Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS)	In collaboration with other Cosponsors of UNAIDS, WFP prepared the report “Follow-up to the 2011 United Nations General Assembly High-Level Meeting (HLM) on AIDS”. The report offered an overview of the support to be provided by UNAIDS to Member States and civil society in order to accelerate progress towards the goals and targets of the 2011 Political Declaration on HIV/AIDS. Given the alignment between the 2011 Political Declaration on HIV and AIDS, and UNAIDS strategy 2011–2015, the Unified Budget Results and Accountability Framework for 2012–2015 describes the activities of each Cosponsor and the UNAIDS Secretariat to achieve these goals. As the convening agency on food and nutrition within the UNAIDS Division of Labour, WFP will take forward the actions described in these declarations and ensure its own participation through the Unified Budget Results and Accountability Framework. WFP’s Executive Board approved a new WFP HIV/AIDS strategy – “Getting to Zero: WFP’s Role as a UNAIDS Cosponsor”, which will support implementation of the UNAIDS strategy and progress towards HLM targets.
