1. Adoption of the Agenda

Pursuant to Rule III of the Rules of Procedure of the Executive Board, the Executive Director hereby presents, **for approval**, the Provisional Annotated Agenda of the Second Regular Session of 2004. During the session, the Board may, by a two-thirds majority of the members present and voting, amend the agenda by deletion, addition or modification of any item.

2. **Evaluation reports**

a) Management response to the PRRO thematic evaluation recommendations

At the First Regular Session 2004, the Board took note of the recommendations contained in the evaluation report WFP/EB.1/2004/6-A and of the interim management response set out in the annex. It further decided that it would begin examination of the final version of the measures taken by the management at its session in May 2004 and would take a decision on a process to be followed. The document is submitted to the Board **for consideration**.

b) Review of WFP's experience with real-time evaluation*

As mentioned in the discussion during the Third Regular Session in October 2003 on the real time evaluation (RTE) of WFP's response to the crisis in southern Africa, the Office of Evaluation was to undertake a review of its experience with the first RTE, with a view to improving the methodology and approach. The paper being presented to the Board **for information** is the result of that work.

c) <u>Information note on the review of the United Nations Joint Logistics Centre</u> (UNJLC) in Liberia*

The review of the UNJLC operations in Liberia is the last of three: the first reviewed the Afghanistan operation in June 2003; the second reviewed the Iraq operation in September 2003. The objective of the reviews was to identify lessons learned and best practices to enhance future UNJLC deployments. This document is presented **for information**.

3. Draft country programmes

In October 2002, the Executive Board approved the harmonized procedure for country programme approval (WFP/EB.3/2002/4-B), whereby draft country programmes will be reviewed by the Board at the Second Regular Session. The country programme will then be posted on the WFP website and approved at the Third Regular Session on a "no-objection" basis, i.e. it will be discussed if, and only if, five Board members or more request it in writing (ref. WFP/EB.2/2003/INF/6). The following country programmes would be reviewed on that basis:
