CORRIGENDUM

Page 2, Note to the Executive Board: The second focal point should read "Yolanda Gonzalez, tel: 6513-2034".

Page 3, paragraph 5, line 6, should read "...The programme targets more than 1.42 million children under six years, 5,040 severely malnourished children under six years, and about 67,500 anganwadi workers (AWWs) and aides.", not "The programme targets more than 800,000 children under three years of age, nearly 1.2 million pre-school children, approximately 7,400 severely malnourished children between three and six years of age, nearly 400,000 expectant and nursing mothers, and 67,500 anganwadi workers (AWWs) and aides."

Page 9, paragraph 33, line 3 should read "...and other donors. At the national level, WFP's project is managed by...", not "...and other donors. WFP's project is managed by..."

Line 5 of paragraph 33 should read "...Within each relevant state's Department of Women and Children's Development (DWCD),...", not "...within the Government's Department of Women and Children's Development (DWCD),..."

Page 13, paragraph 57 b), the heading should read "*Exploring use of donor survey programmes as a vehicle for impact evaluation.*", not "*The country office should explore utilizing donor survey programmes as a vehicle for impact evaluation.*"

Paragraph 57 c) should read "*Evaluating possible participation in the annual UNICEF Multi-Indicator Survey in all states.* The UNICEF survey is a prime source of key intermediate outcome data that can also be utilized for WFP project design and targeting.", not "*Evaluating the potential to buy into the annual UNICEF Multi-Indicator Survey in all states supported by UNICEF in order to obtain key intermediate outcome data.*"
