

Structural Improvements

- Strengthened the causal logic between output and outcomes
- Improved clarity in attribution
- Sharpened targets realistic and achievable
- Established business rules notably concerning baselines
- Methodological detail on the outcome indicators

- Greater attention to key cross cutting issues
 - Gender
 - Partnerships
 - Protection and accountability to beneficiaries
- Mainstreaming capacity building throughout.
