Climate change is the defining challenge of our times. *La Niña* is causing critical changes to normal rainfall patterns...








No alleviation of the hunger pressure: maize prices have increased in DR Congo, Kenya, Rwanda, Tanzania Uganda and Somalia ...








Innovative programming and New Initiatives

WFP's support in the region is expanding: 260,000 clients in HIV or TB care received WFP's support in 2010.







And we must procure the right food at the best price as close as possible to where it is needed...

✓ In 2010, WFP purchased 783,000mt of food in this region valued at US\$ 241 million.

✓ And through Purchase for Progress (P4P), WFP purchased 75,000 mt of food valued at US\$ 22 million from 45,000 small holder farmers in ten countries.
