
How is WFP funded? 100% voluntarily funded



WFP's Funding Targets


- Raise resources to meet assessed needs


2004 WFP Top 10 Donors

What is full cost recovery?

Each donation covers the cost of the operation including food and full operational & support costs:

Commodity	49%
External Transport	9%
LTSH	22%
Other Direct Costs (ODOC)	7%
Direct Support Costs (DSC)	13%
Indirect Support Costs (ISC)	7%

The way forward:

- bring greater predictability and broaden the partnership;
- encourage contributions from host governments, and pooled or thematic funds;
- strengthen support from emerging economies;
- invest in country-level resource mobilisation efforts;
- encourage contributions and mechanisms which ensure the most effective, responsive, transparent and efficient use of resources.
