

Anemia (Hb<11g/dl) in children under five in LAC




- National averages mask significant regional differences in malnutrition prevalence and deep pockets of hunger within the countries
- High prevalence of chronic malnutrition is closely associated with high concentrations of Afro-descendant and indigenous populations






Indigenous and Afro-descendants in Rural Areas



Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR): Latin America and Caribbean Emergency Response Network (LACERN)





Key components

- 1. Strengthen the rapid response capacity at regional and sub-regional levels
- 2. Strengthen our preparedness systems and tools (including early warning and information management services)
- 3. Establish operational relations with national, regional and international actors and institutions
- 4. Emphasis on local and national capacity building











Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR): 1.Rapid response capacity at the regional and sub-regional level (LACERN)



- Main UN Humanitarian Response Depot (UNHRD) established in Panama
- Three sub-regional humanitarian response hubs established in El Salvador, Barbados and Ecuador
- Emergency food and equipment prepositioned in the hub network




- Stand-by roster of 55 WFP Emergency
 Officers in LAC established and available for
 immediate deployment
- Cluster lead agency in humanitarian logistics, offering services to broader humanitarian community (REDLAC)





Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR):4. Capacity building (LACERN)





- Organization of planning events (hurricane season preparedness)
- Technical support to national counterpart organizations (ie, Ministry of Health, Civil Protection, Scientific institutions), including through project initiatives
- Capacity building with other counterparts and NGOs at a national level (for instance through joint work via UNETE, or through WFP preparedness activities)
- Facilitating knowledge exchanges (including through South-South cooperation mechanism)







Eradicating Chronic Malnutrition in Children

CENTRAL AMERICA

- A Regional Steering Committee with high-level representatives from Belize, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Honduras, Guatemala, Nicaragua, Panama and Dominican Republic, was established through a joint technical assistance project with the IADB to develop national plans to eradicate chronic malnutrition in the region
- The plans are being prepared by the Health Ministries of the region and joint visits are being carried-out to the ministries of finance to advocate for allocation of resources in support of the plan implementation
- WFP is leading a UN effort in the region to develop a regional UN project to support the countries in their efforts to achieve this common goal
- The initiative has obtained political support from the Heads of State of the region thanks to WFP advocacy efforts



Eradicating Chronic Malnutrition in Children

ANDEAN REGION

Consultation on eradicating child malnutrition by 2015 in the Andean Region Lima the 23rd-24th of November 2006

1. Jointly organized by:

Governments of Peru and Chile and WFP, in collaboration with PAHO/WHO, UNICEF and Andean Community of Nations (CAN) & International Cooperation Agency of Chile (AGCI)

2.Participation of:

Peruvian President, Alan Garcia, the Minister of Health of Chile, the Minister of Health of Bolivia 150 representatives from Ministries of Health and Social Development, financial institutions, NGOs, international development agencies, academic community and regional experts in this sub-region.

3:Results

Acta de Lima to strengthen the cooperation between UN agencies, and Government to eradicate child malnutrition by 2015

Conclusions and recommendations will be presented in next Andean Council Meeting of Ministries of Social Development and Meeting of Ministries of Health of the Andean Region.


