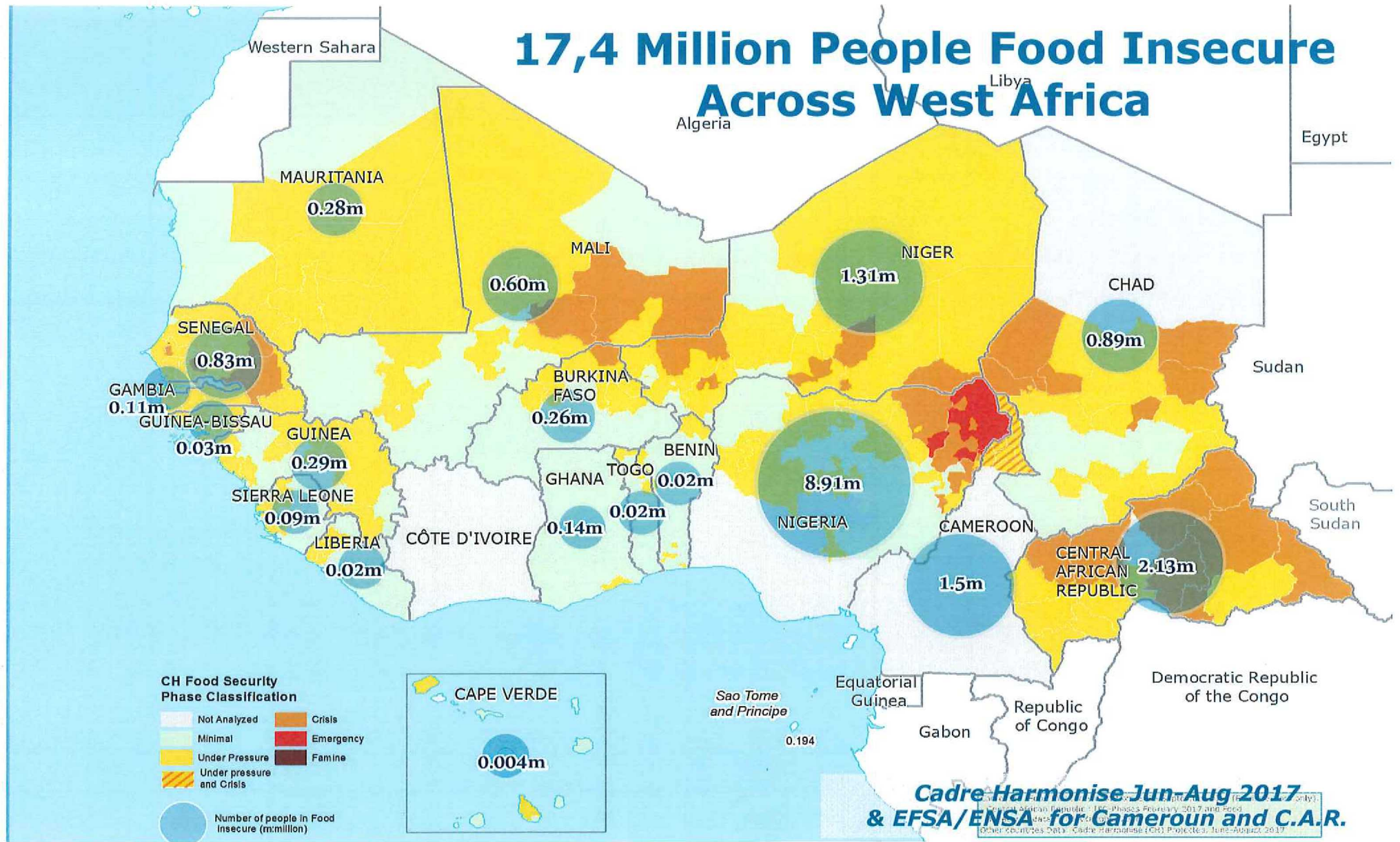

The Lean Season Set In

- **14,7m** people food insecure
 - 1.7 million severely
 - 60% in Nigeria.
- Prioritizing among **4,3m people** targeted
- In kind food & CBT, Nutrition programming & Resilience/ recovery activities
- **Break the cycle** of poverty, food insecurity and malnutrition in the Sahel



High interdependency - Huge Regional Impact

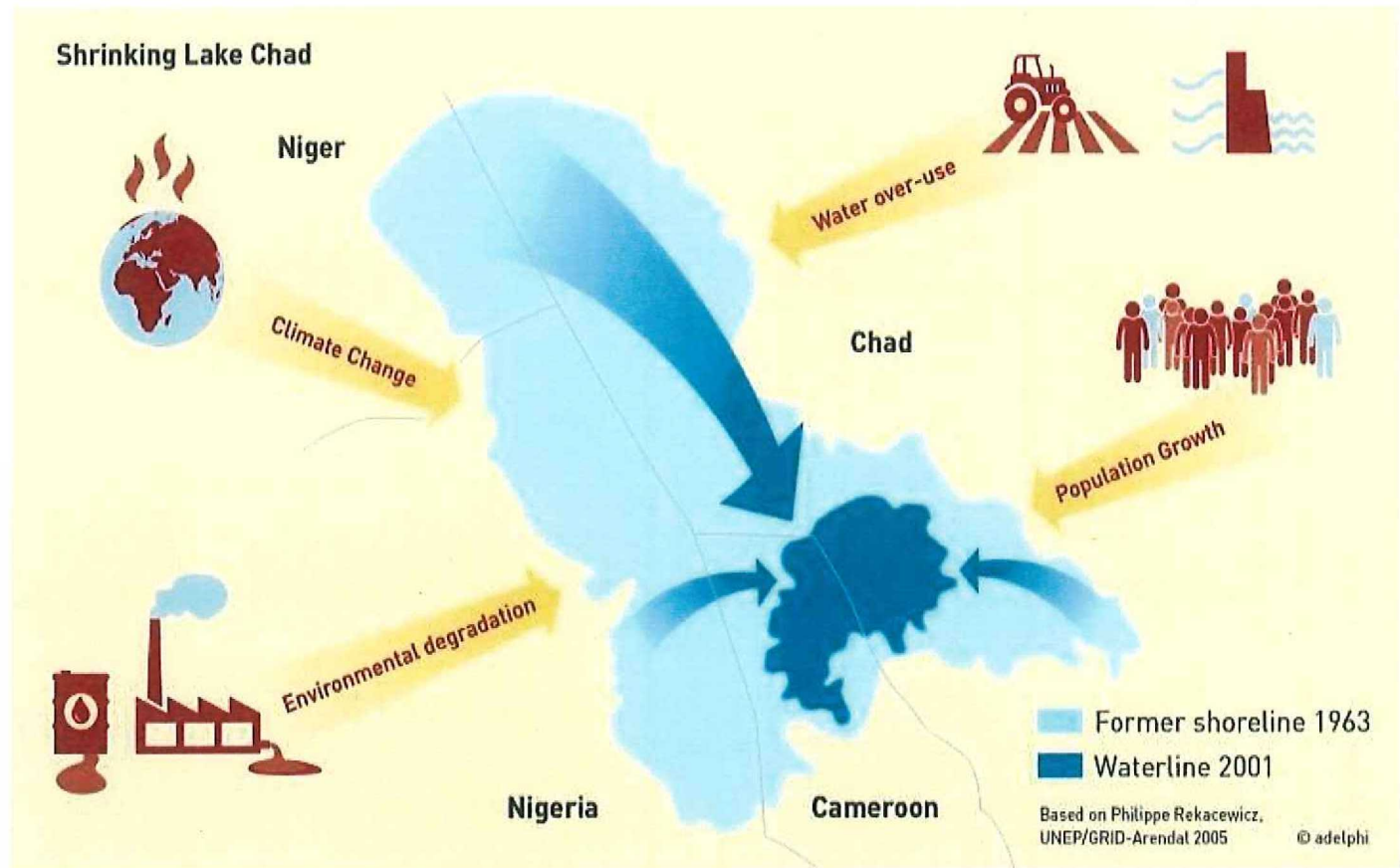


7 million in need of food assistance

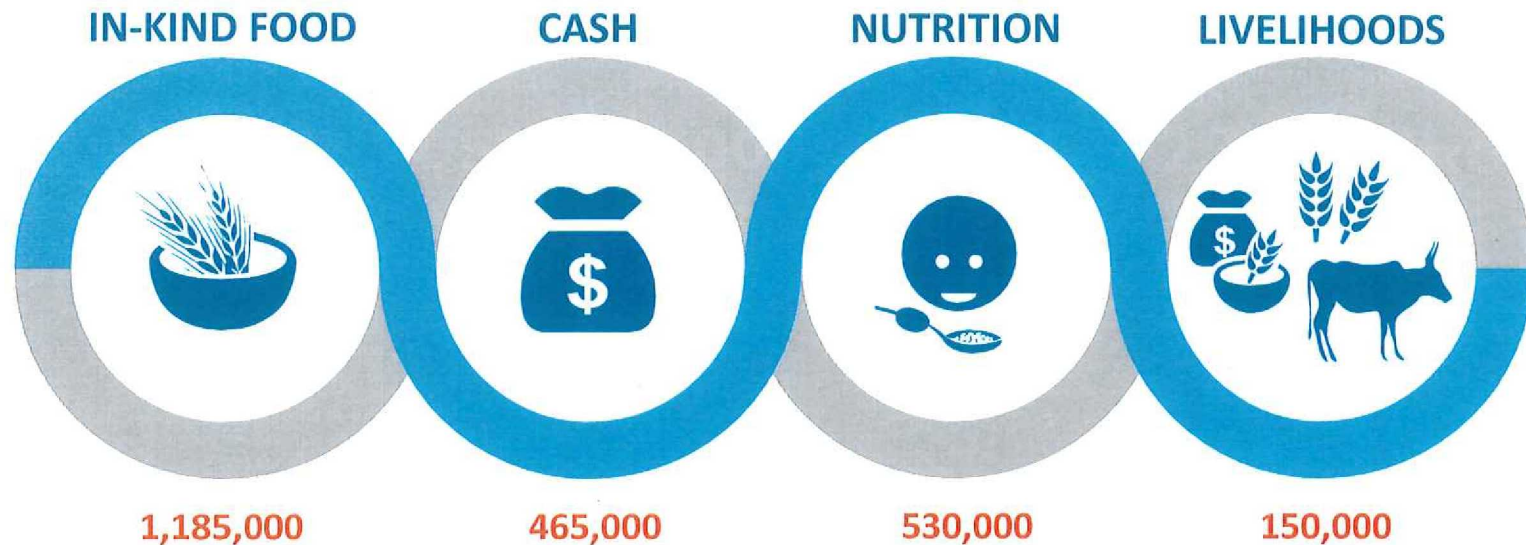


2m people displaced

(2,1m) hungry in CAR

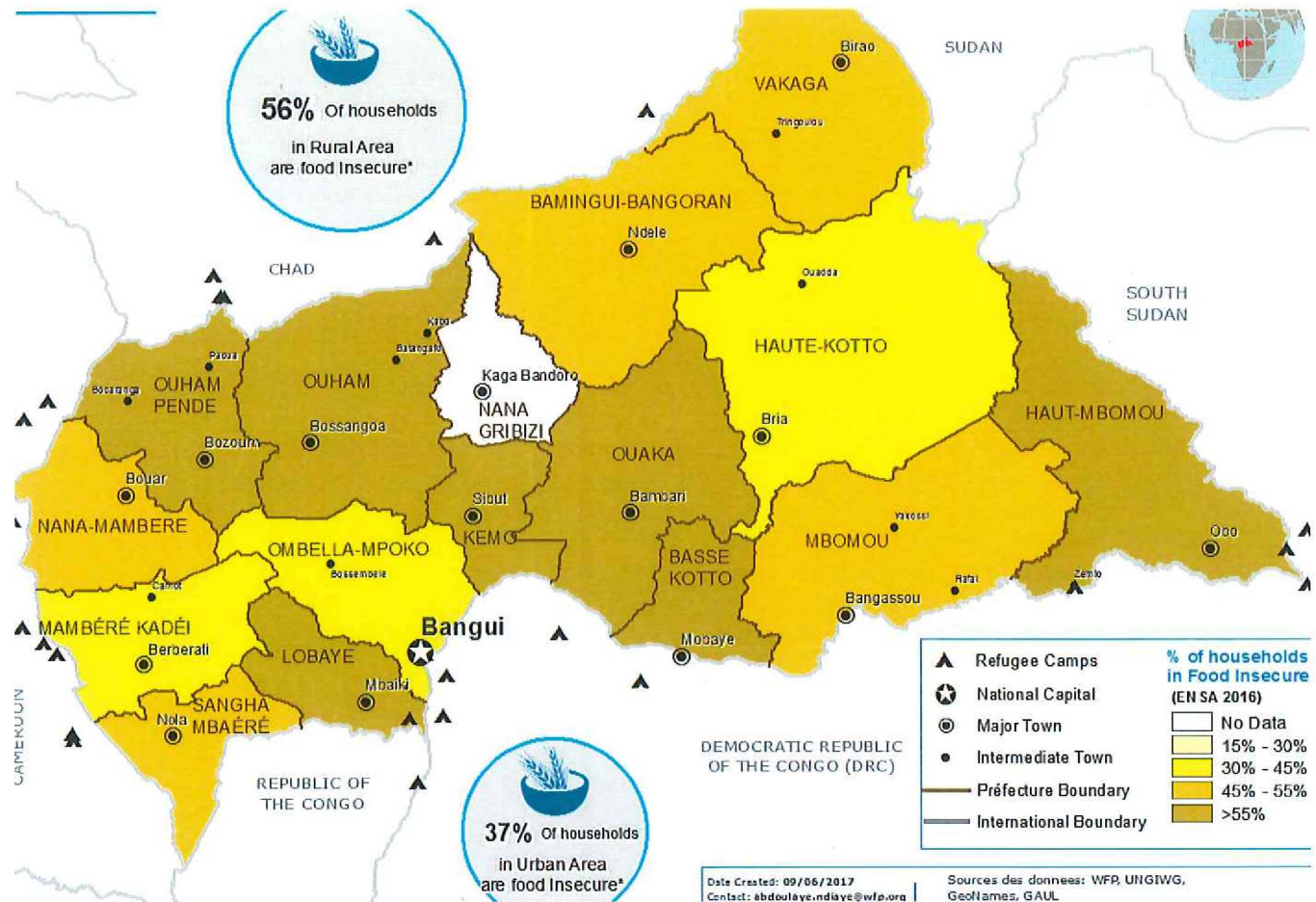


1m people displaced or refugees

- C.A.R **epicenter** of the crisis, massive new displacements
- **Prioritization and ration cuts** leading to negative coping mechanisms and tensions
- **US\$ 50m** needed until December 2017
- Beyond life saving, **investment** is required

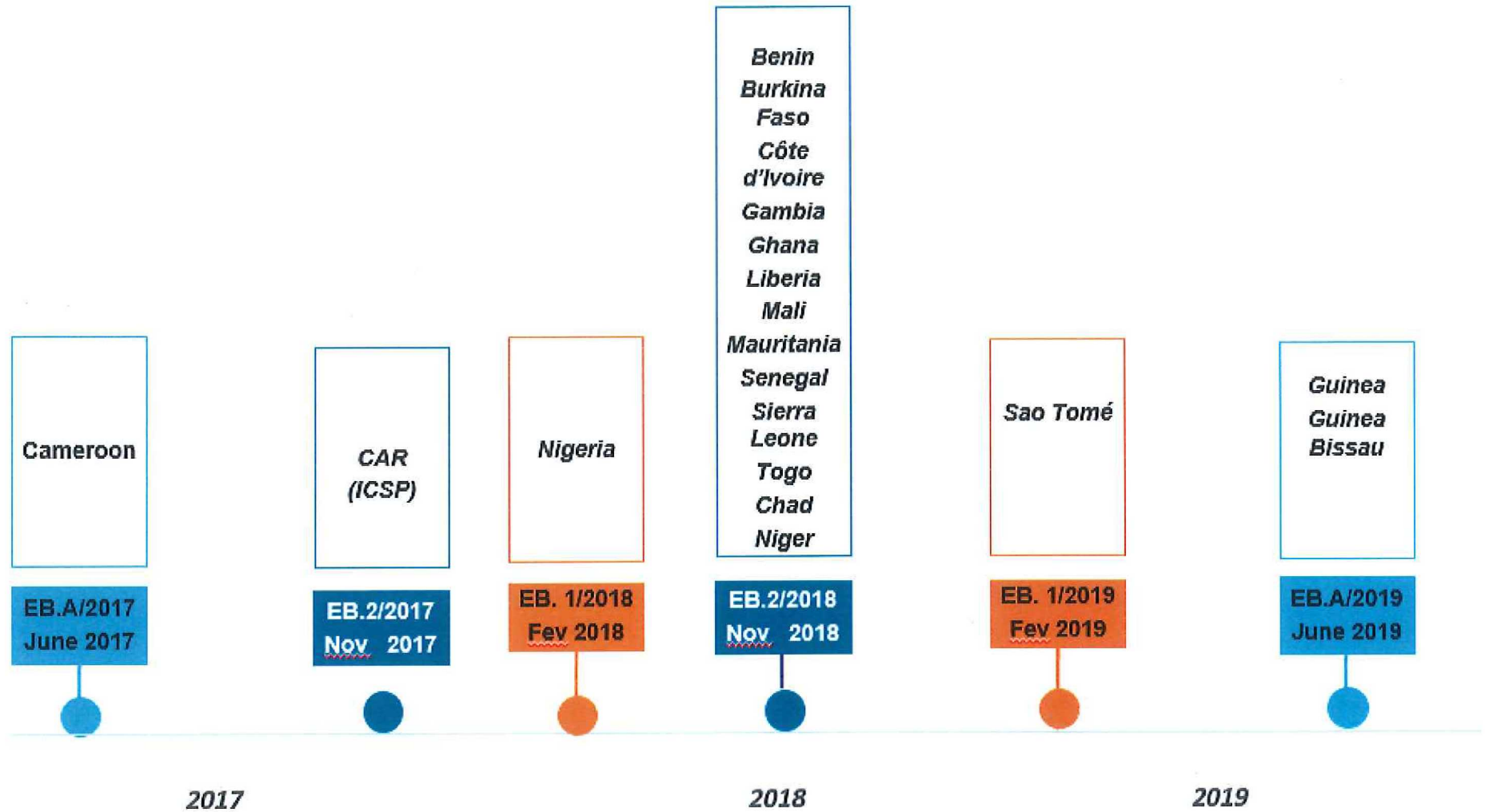

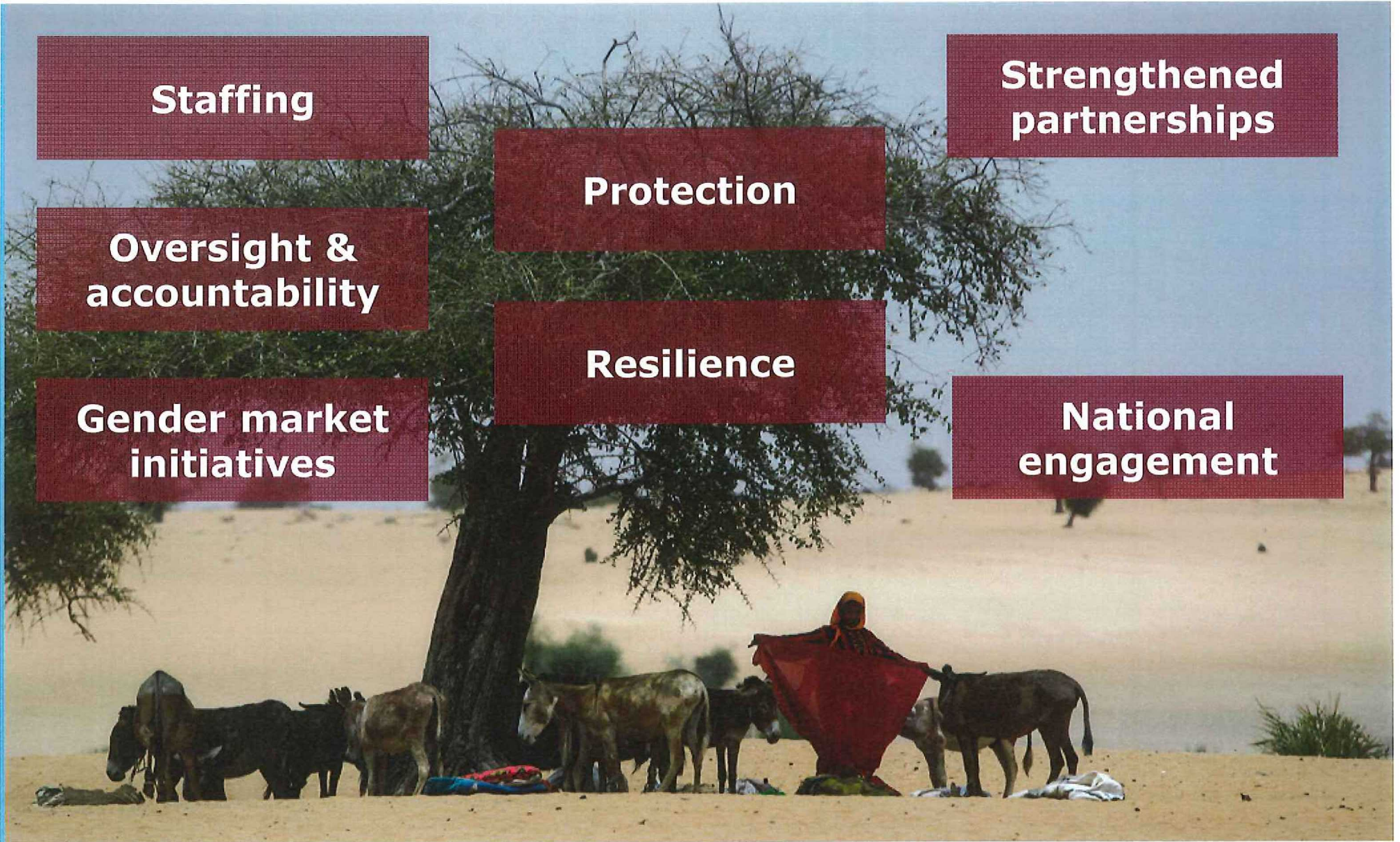

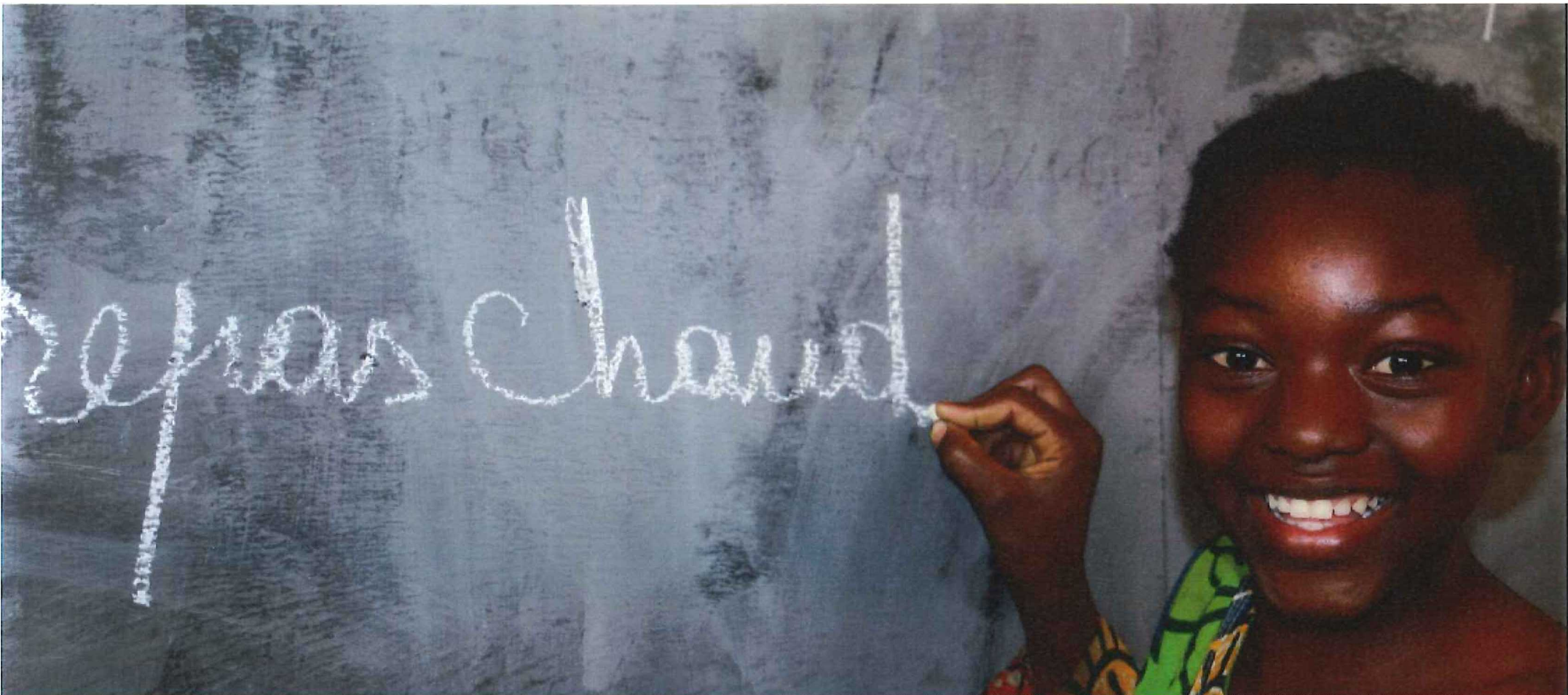
