

Learning event on Making Evaluation Work for the Achievement of SDG 4.5: Equality and Inclusion in Education

Introduction

School feeding programmes offer multiple benefits for communities. When planned and delivered well, they promote education and child nutrition, contribute to inclusiveness and gender parity, and support local smallholder farmers, areas highly relevant to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. Between January and June 2019, UNESCO led an inter-agency effort to synthesize evidence from a wide range of evaluations on school feeding. The results of this effort have been articulated in an evaluation synthesis report on "Making Evaluation Work for the Achievement of SDG 4 Target 5: Equality and Inclusion in Education". Evidence from WFP's school feeding evaluations was included and WFP participated as a member of the Reference Group.

Following the publication of this report, WFP has invited UNESCO and the lead author, Professor Karen Mundy, to present key findings from the report that relate to school feeding. This learning event, coorganized by the WFP Office of Evaluation (OEV) and the School Feeding Service (PDS), will also be the opportunity to showcase WFP's achievements in school feeding as well as discuss some of the challenges with the aim of informing future programme design.
