



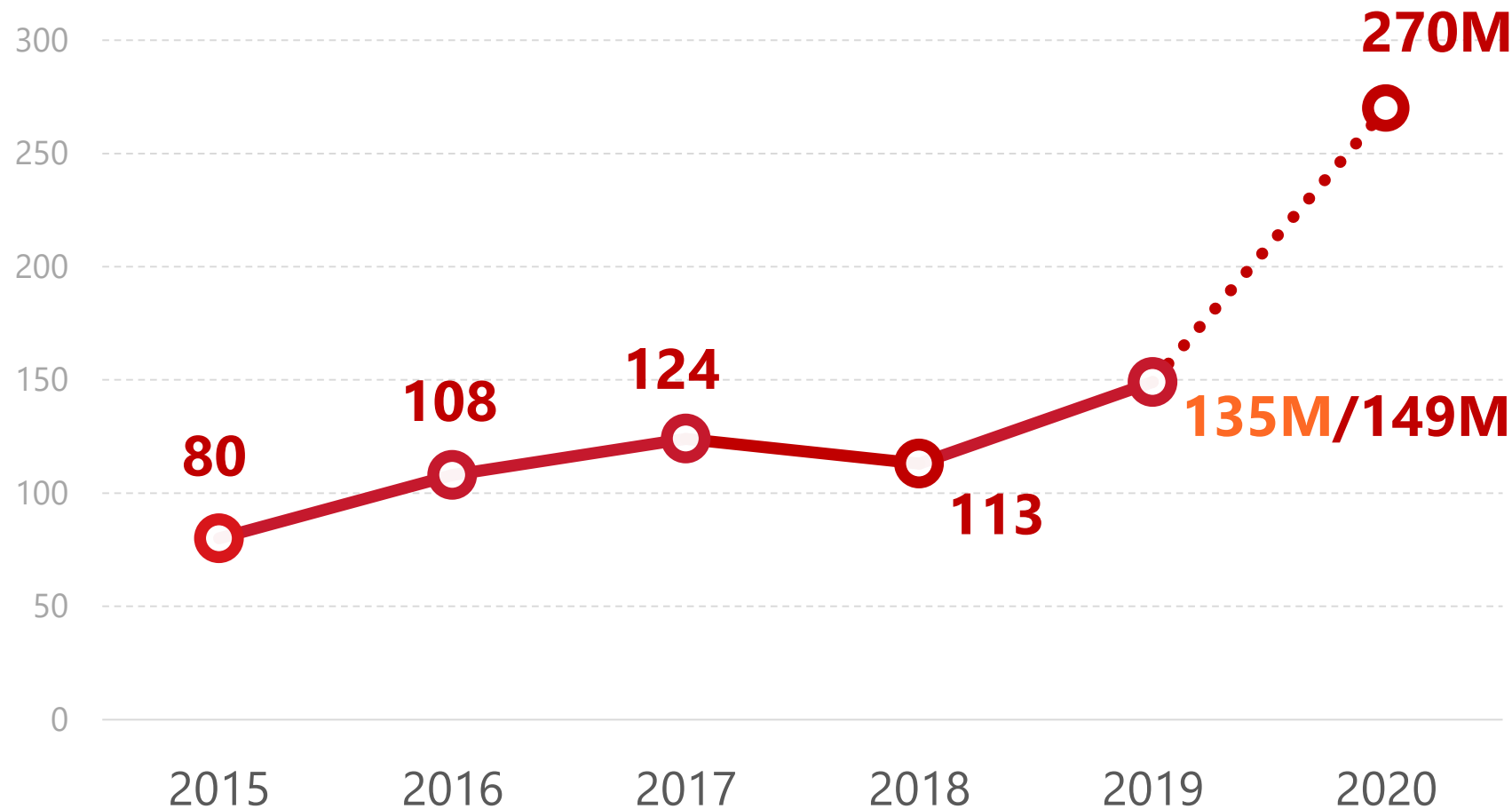

STATE OF FOOD INSECURITY – ACUTE HUNGER IS ON THE RISE

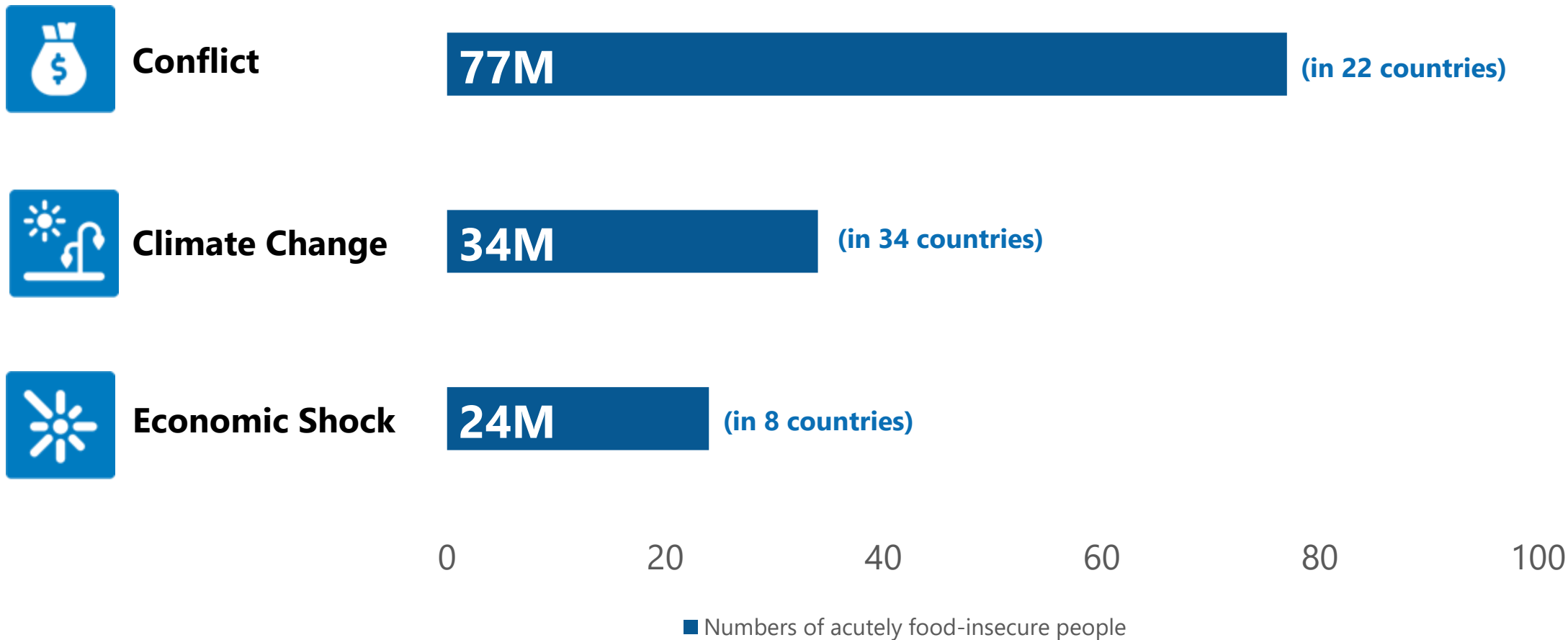
Acute hunger



The **number of acutely food insecure people** in the world could increase **by 80%** from **149 million in 2019 to 270 million** before the end of 2020.

121 million people will fall into **acute hunger** in 2020 due to the **impact of COVID-19**.

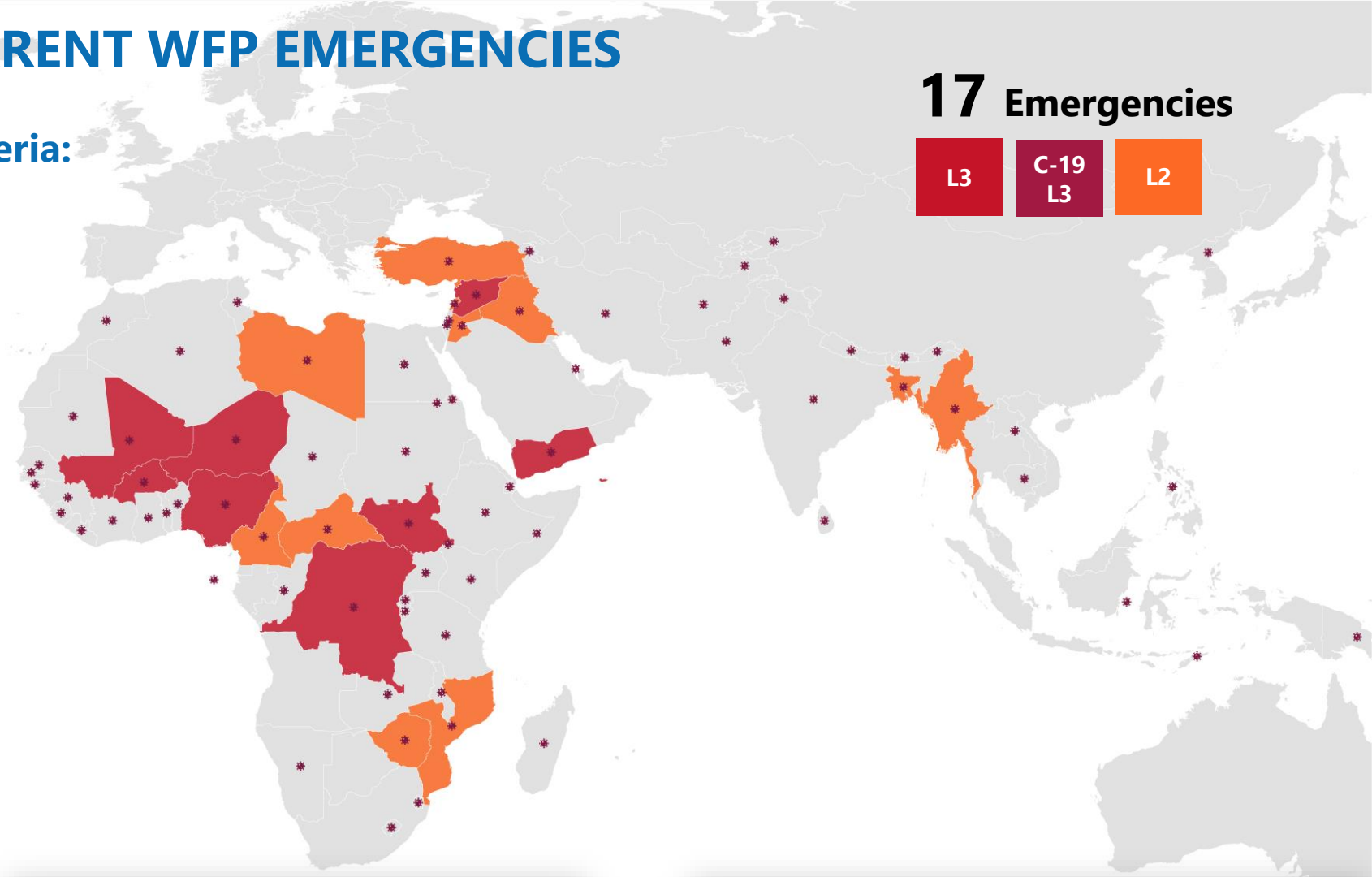

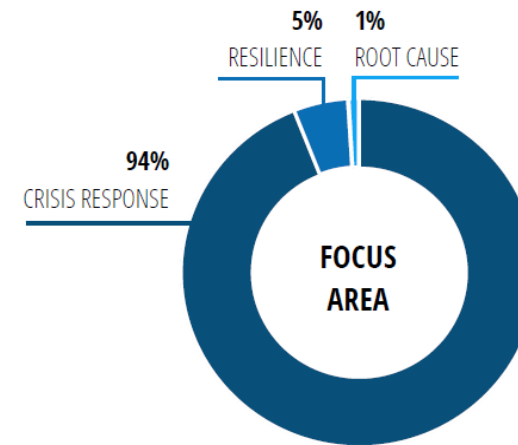

Sustain conflict and lean season response in Sahel, NE Nigeria, C.A.R and Cameroon
Notable scale-up in urban areas and coastal countries (Guinea, Liberia, Gambia, Ghana, Togo more than doubling crisis response reqs)

WFP is appealing for **USD 4.9 billion** across **83 operations** to target **38 million additional beneficiaries**.



This represents **62%** of the total budget through end 2020, including an **additional USD 1.7 billion** in scale-up requirements (94% dedicated to crisis response).

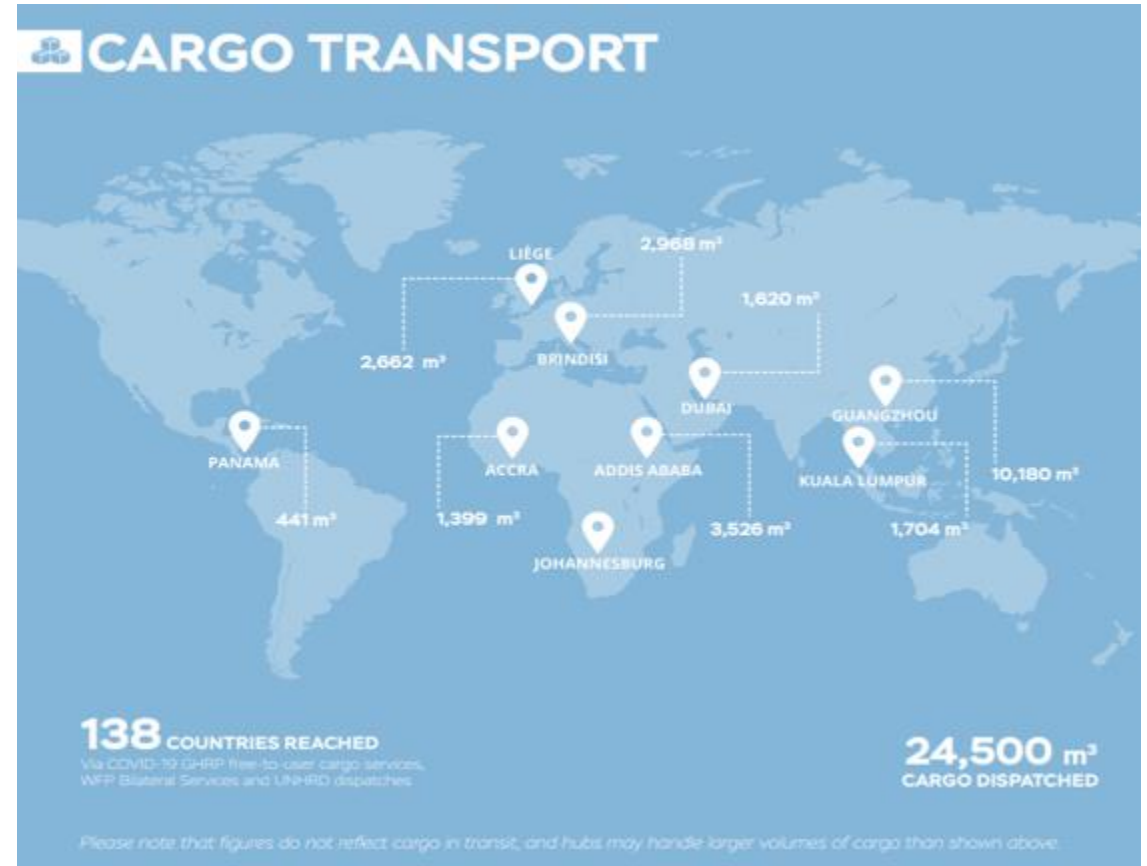
