



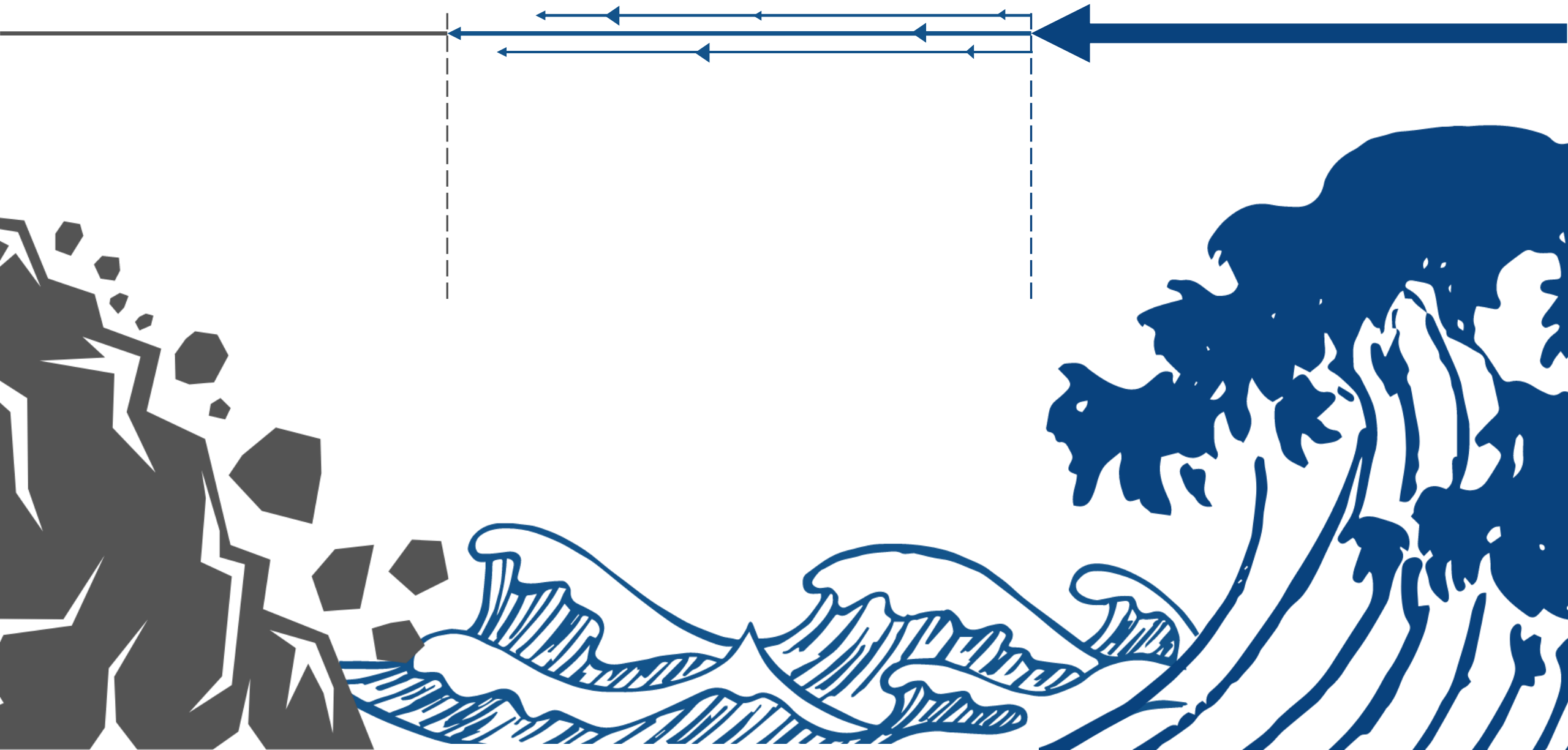

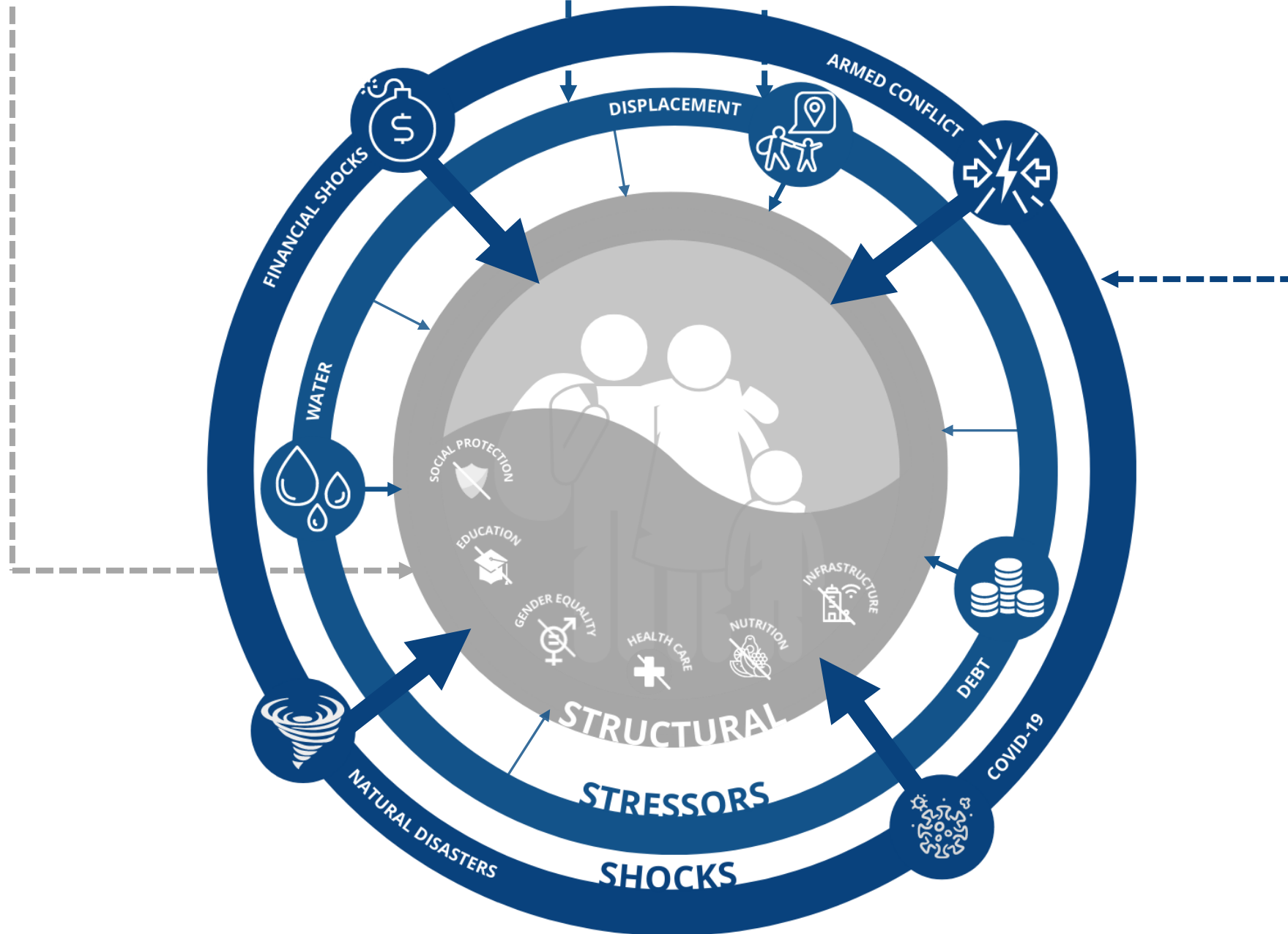

### Local procurement

**Locally sourced commodities** injects financial resources in the **local economy**, stimulating markets, as well as value and supply chains.

In addition, such locally sourced food assistance **supports the livelihoods of local farmers.**

### Nutrition sensitive

**Nutrition sensitive food assistance** accounts for the **differentiated nutritional requirements of populations**, notably children and PLG/W.

Beyond immediate assistance, nutritional counselling also durably contributes to **human capital development.**

### CBT

Beyond meeting food, nutrition and essential needs, **CBT- interventions also stimulate local economies.**

In addition, CBT can support **financial inclusion** and, through mobile money, incentivizes the private sector to bring **connectivity & services to rural areas.**

### Social Protection

Channeling assistance through **shock-responsive social protection** strengthens national institutions & systems (including through vertical/horizontal expansion).

It also **links beneficiaries to durable safety nets** as well as **complementary programmes and social services.**
