

# WFP and the UN Food Systems Summit

18 months process, in which:

- WFP served as Anchor Agency for Resilience Action Area
- WFP also actively engaged in the 4 other Action Areas
- Helped process 2500 “game-changing” solutions
- Co-leading 8 coalitions/alliances
- Supporting 148 national dialogues for food systems transformation
