# WFP RESPONSE IN NUMBERS

(As of 2 April)



**1 million people reached**  
*Planned 6 m scale-up by June*



**US\$158 M mobilized**



**39,000 mt of food procured**  
*46% procured inside Ukraine*



**10 warehouses (+35.000 sqm capacity)**  
*(5 inside Ukraine; 6 outside)*



**60 dedicated fleet**  
*(in Poland, Ukraine and Romania)*



**Re-establishing sea access**



**50% transported by rail**



**50% transported by road**



**2 corridors in use**  
*(Southern corridor via Romania & north-western via Poland)*



**Self-enrollment tool**  
*For CBT and In-kind*



**10 partner agreements**

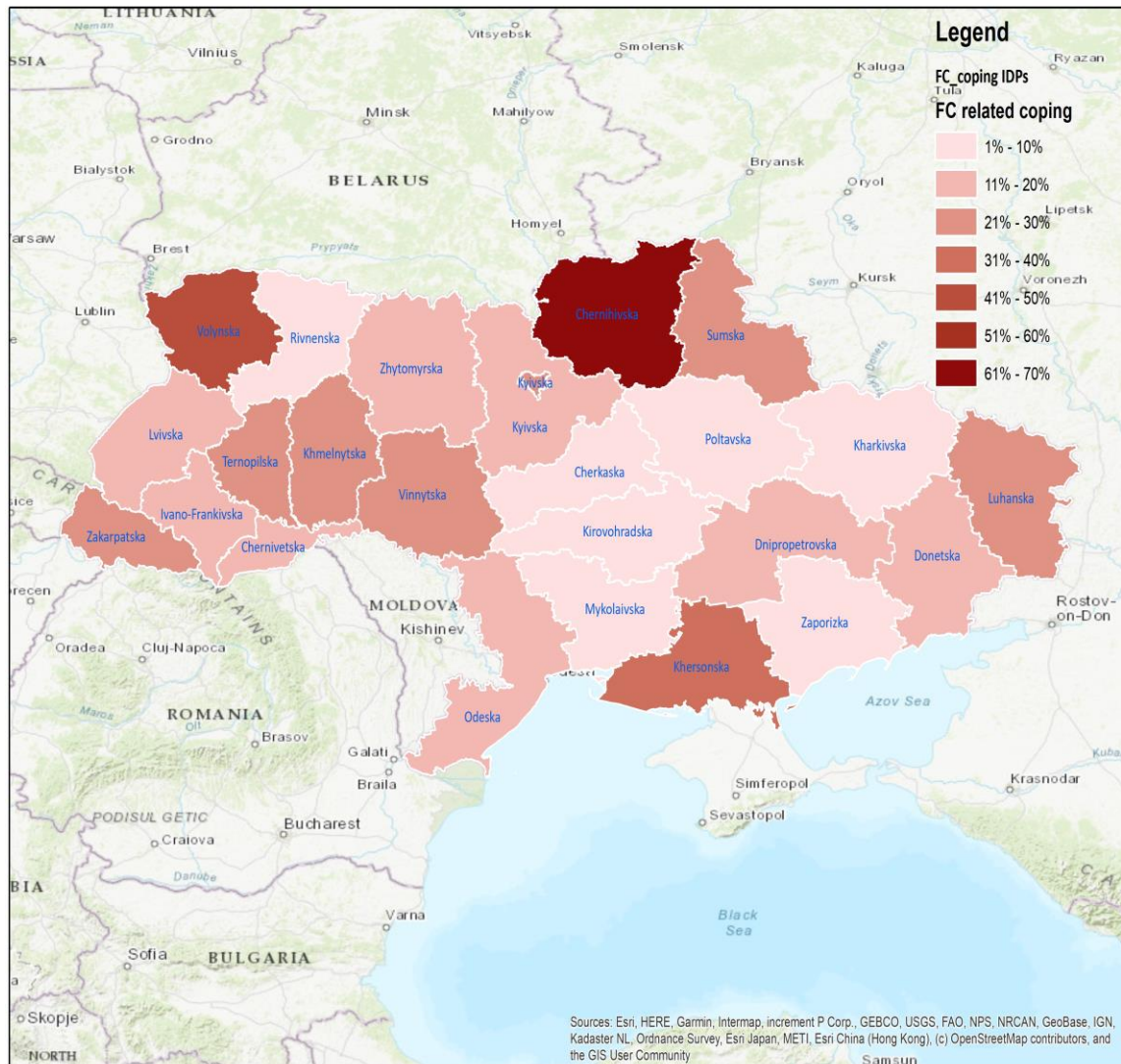

# NEEDS ON THE GROUND



- **30% of the population** – including 50% of the IDPs - reported **some level food insecurity**
- **3 in 4 IDPs** reported **abandoning their valuable household assets**
- The **top three concerns** for IDPs were:
  - **32%** safety
  - **28%** food
  - **24%** fuel for transportation
- **23%** ate less than two meals per day
- **46%** are **worried** about having enough food
- East, north and south areas have **highest rates of food insecurity at 60%**
- **One third** of respondents in Kyiv, eastern and northern regions reported that **stores were no longer operating in their neighbourhoods**

# WFP RESPONSE PILLARS

## 1 HARD TO REACH AREAS

*In-Kind Assistance to Encircled Cities and Conflict-Affected Populations*

- Ready to eat Rapid Response Rations
- Bread provided by bakeries
- General Food Distributions to resident and IDP populations
- Institutional feeding modalities to address critical gaps at the city and community levels

## 2 IMMEDIATE RELIEF AND TRANSITION TO SOCIAL PROTECTION

*CBT assistance where markets are functioning*

- Cash for essential needs through Financial Services Providers
- Food value vouchers with retailers
- Engagement with Social Protection actors for beneficiary enrolment and cash assistance

## 3 MARKET FUNCTIONALITY

*Preserve Market Functionality*

- Real time market monitoring
- Cash injection to prop-up national supply chain
- Identify supply gaps to be remedied

# CASH-BASED TRANSFERS



**Self-enrolment tool** for cash assistance



**2,100 Western Union outlets**  
active across the country

*Enables fast payment & daily transfer of US\$5 million or average of 2 million beneficiaries/month*



**241 Silpo retailers** across the country  
*Enables US\$10 million transfer per month*



**Additional Financial Service Providers**  
being contracted



**Two-thirds** of the US\$75 MPC transfer value  
caters to people's food needs



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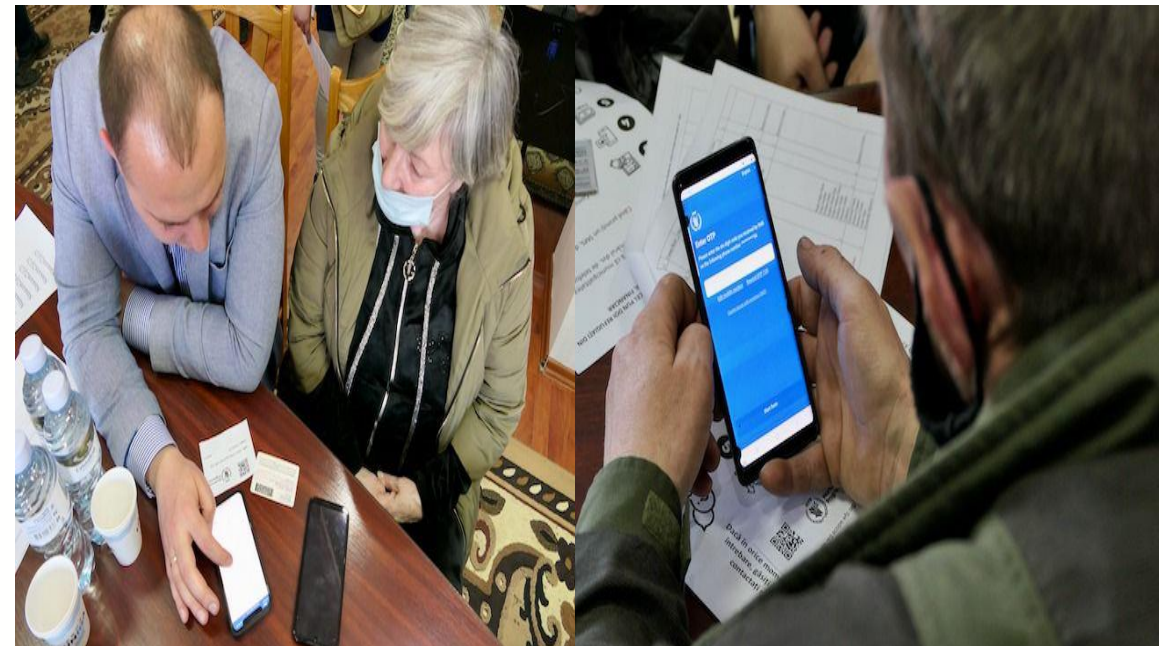

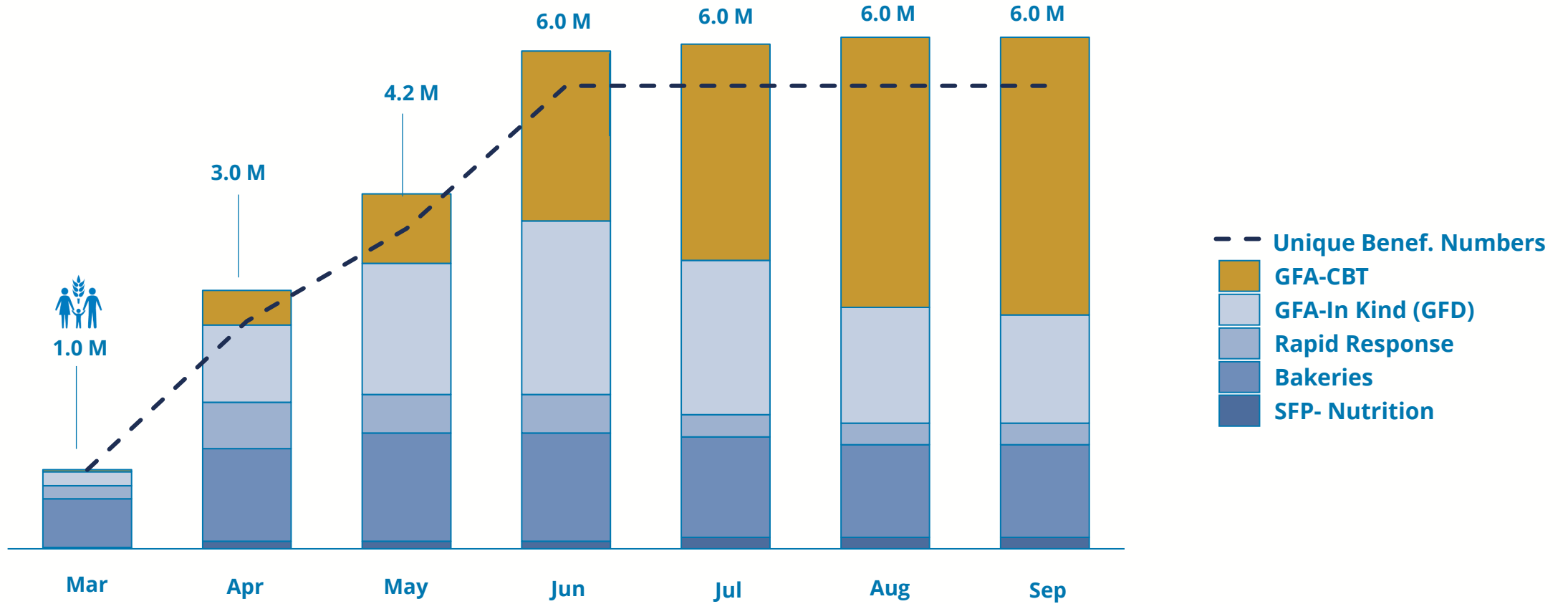

- ✓ **Internally displaced people, vulnerable host communities and people living in encircled areas**
- ✓ Households with **disabled members**
- ✓ Households with **pregnant and breastfeeding women**
- ✓ Households with **high dependency-rations**
- ✓ **6 -23 months children in conflict-affected areas**



## METHODOLOGY

- ✓ **Evidence from ongoing phone-assisted nationwide surveys**
- ✓ **Qualitative assessments**
- ✓ **Consultations with affected populations**

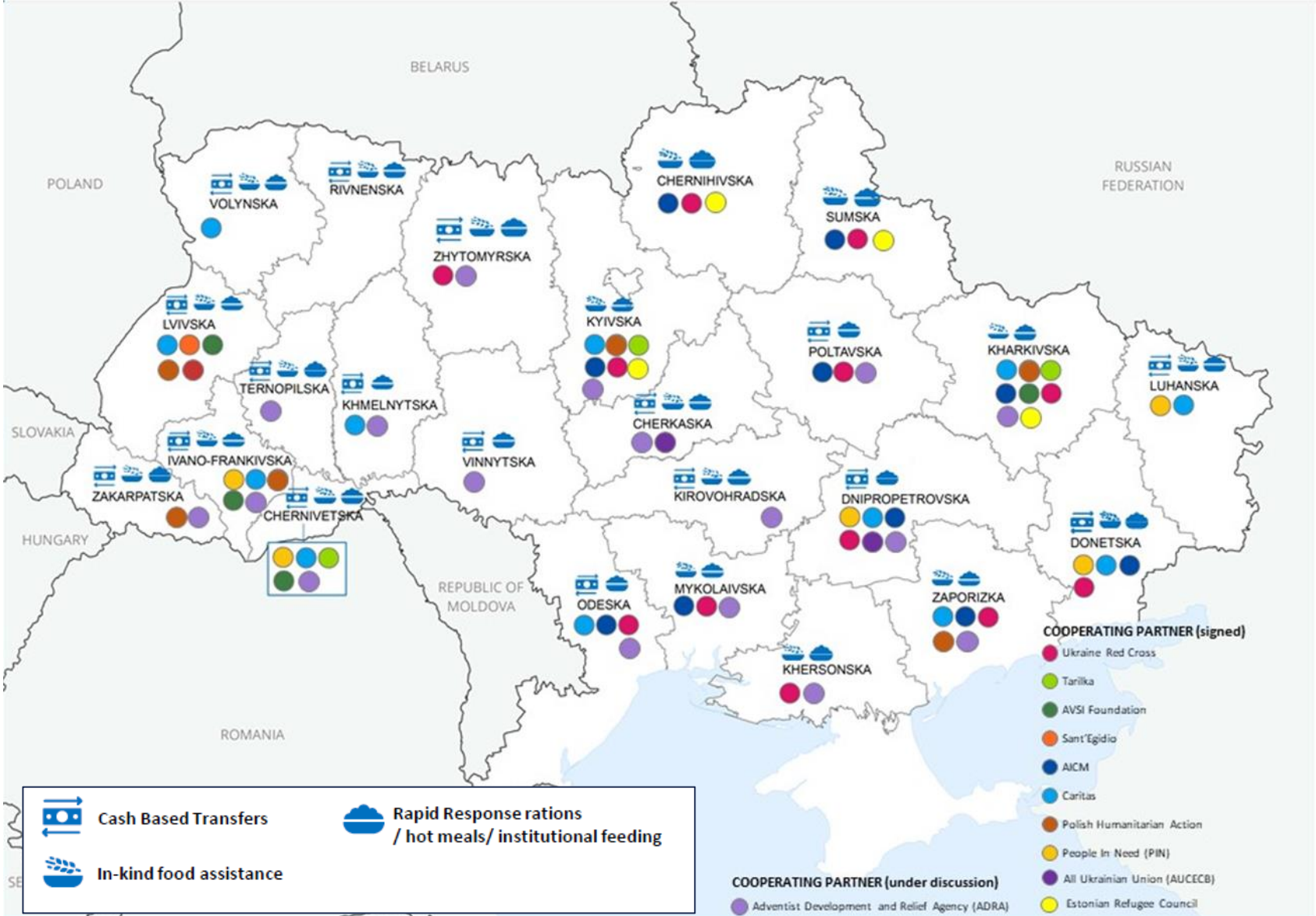

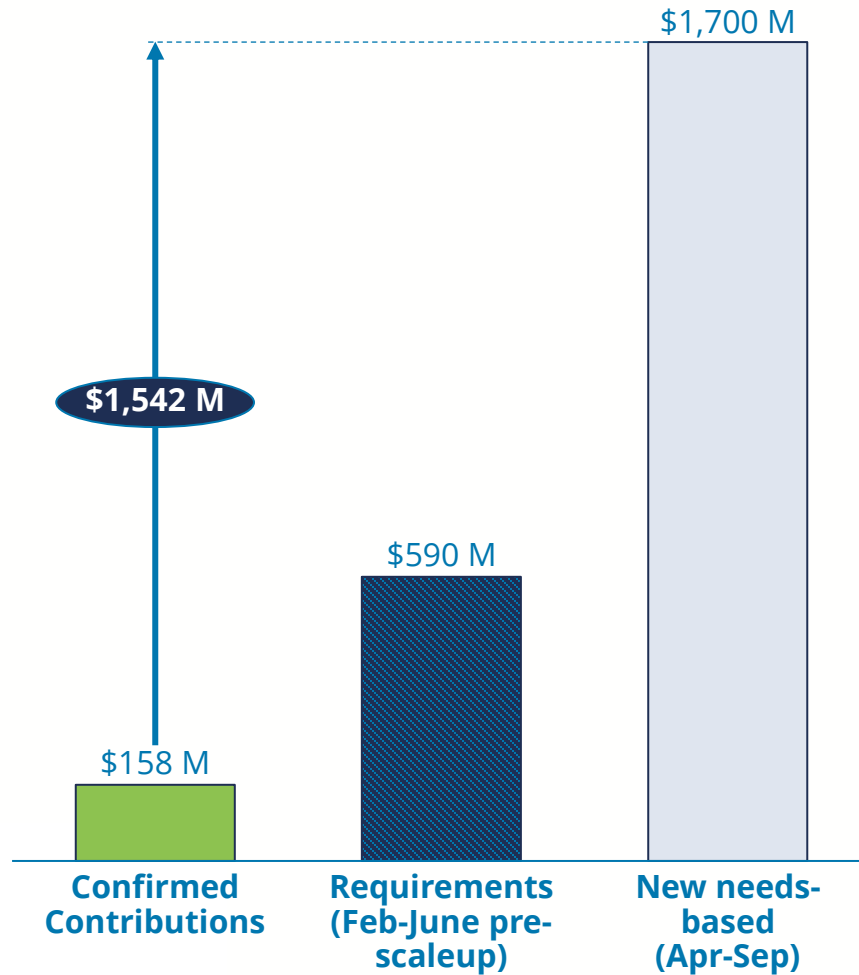
