FORECAST DEFINITIONS


CONFIRMED: The Financial Agreement has been <u>signed</u> and <u>revenue</u> <u>has been recorded</u> in WFP books.

HIGH: WFP has <u>reached agreement with both</u> the Government and the International Financial Institution. The agreement amount has been determined. The contract is being written up and finalized.

MEDIUM: WFP has <u>reached agreement with either</u> the Government or the International Financial Institution. The agreement amount may be within a range, and subject to further refining. Negotiations between all three parties have started, but not yet reached conclusion.

SCOPING: WFP has <u>jointly identified specific financing and/or implementation opportunities</u> together with either Government or the International Financial Institution. The agreement amount may be specific or a ballpark estimate. Follow up discussions are taking place.
