Context





Strategic orientation

- Builds on the CSPE recommendations and achievements of the first generation CSP by introducing two outcome areas:
 - A new portfolio empowering women smallholder farmers through resilience to climate change and participation in value chains
 - Expansion of country capacity strengthening for social protection, school feeding, healthy diets, and emergency preparedness & response
- Adopts a food systems approach that integrates the production, aggregation, transformation, marketing and consumption of nutritious food across outcomes
- Expands WFP private sector engagement and support for a One
 UN approach to emergency preparedness and response
