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# PROVISIONAL ANNOTATED AGENDA

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## 1. Adoption of the Agenda

Pursuant to Rule III of the Rules of Procedure of the Executive Board, the Executive Director hereby presents, **for approval**, the Provisional Annotated Agenda of the First Regular Session of 2013. During the session, the Board may, by a two-thirds majority of the members present and voting, amend the agenda by deletion, addition or modification of any item.

## 2. Election of the Bureau and Appointment of the Rapporteur

In accordance with Rule IV of its Rules of Procedure, the Executive Board shall elect among the representatives of its members a President, a Vice President and three other members (collectively designated as the Bureau), as well as an alternate. They shall hold office until their successors are elected. Each member and alternate of the Bureau shall be chosen from one of the Lists of States as defined in Appendix A to the General Regulations of WFP.

Pursuant to Rule XII and in keeping with the established methods of work, the Board may appoint a Rapporteur from among the representatives.

#### 3. Current and Future Strategic Issues

Under this item, the Executive Director will make an oral presentation to the Board on current and future strategic issues facing WFP.

## Annual Report for 2012 to ECOSOC and FAO Council

The Annual Report to the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations (ECOSOC) and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) Council is presented at the First Regular Session every year in accordance with the Board's 2004 decision on streamlining corporate reporting to the Board and WFP parent bodies (2004/EB.A/11). The report provides a comprehensive picture of WFP's engagement in United Nations system-wide activities, organized according to the common format for United Nations funds and programme reports to ECOSOC and taking into account the comments expressed by the WFP Board on the desired content of the report. This report is presented to the Board **for approval**.

## Appointment of the Inspector General and Director of the Oversight Office

The Executive Director will recommend to the Board, **for approval**, the proposed candidate to the post of the Inspector General and Director of the Oversight Office.

The evaluation will look at the immediate and longer-term effects of food assistance to refugees in protracted situations and draw lessons on how short-term



actions affect the potential for positive long-term effects. It will include assessing the impacts of past operations. It will draw lessons from this experience that can inform how WFP and the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) may want to adjust their programming.

b) <u>Summary Report of the Joint UNHCR/WFP Impact Evaluation on the Contribution</u> <u>of Food Assistance to Durable Solutions in Protracted Refugee Situations in</u> <u>Bangladesh and Management Response</u>

The evaluation will look at the immediate and longer-term effects of food assistance to refugees in protracted situations and draw lessons on how short-term actions affect the potential for positive long-term effects. It will include assessing the impacts of past operations. It will draw lessons from this experience that can inform how WFP and UNHCR may want to adjust their programming.

c) <u>Synthesis Summary Report of the Joint UNHCR/WFP Impact Evaluations on the</u> <u>Contribution of Food Assistance to Durable Solutions in Protracted Refugee</u> <u>Situations and Management Response</u>

This synthesis evaluation will complete the series of impact evaluations on the impact of food assistance to refugees in protracted situations by analysing findings and conclusions from the four component evaluations conducted in Bangladesh, Chad, Ethiopia and Rwanda and deriving strategic recommendations for enhancing the effectiveness of international policy and programming towards durable solutions for refugees in protracted situations.
