DECISIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Adoption of the Agenda

The Board adopted the agenda as presented.

In accordance with Rule XII of its Rules of Procedure, the Board appointed Mr Erizal Sodikin (Indonesia, List B) Rapporteur of the Second Regular Session of 2007.

OPENING REMARKS BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

2007/EB.2/1 Opening Remarks by the Executive Director

The Board took note of the presentation by the Executive Director, as well as those by Mr J. Diouf, Director-General of FAO and Sir John Holmes, Under-Secretary General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator. The main points of the presentations and the Board's comments would be contained in the summary of the work of the session.

POLICY ISSUES

2007/EB.2/2 WFP Strategic Plan Concept Note

The Board took note of the WFP Strategic Plan Concept Note and its Annexes (WFP/EB.2/2007/4-A) and encouraged further work towards the formulation of the WFP Strategic Plan (2008–2011) in consultation with the Board, and taking into account the issues raised by the Board during its discussion.

2007/EB.2/3 Gender and Geographical Diversity: a Way Forward for Meeting Established Targets

Having reviewed document WFP/EB.2/2007/4-B, the Board took note of the methods WFP proposed for improving gender and geographical representation in the international professional staff category; it reiterated the decision taken at its Second Regular Session in 2006 to request the Secretariat to present at its Second Regular Session in 2008 a comprehensive strategy on human resources which would facilitate attainment of the Strategic Plan objectives.

RESOURCE, FINANCIAL AND BUDGETARY MATTERS

2007/EB.2/4 WFP Biennial Management Plan (2008–2009)

Having considered WFP's Biennial Management Plan Budget for 2008–2009, as submitted by the Executive Director in document WFP/EB.2/2007/5-A/1, the Board:

- i) as allowed under Financial Regulation 2.1, **approved** an exemption from Financial Regulation 9.2, which requires that the proposed Management Plan be circulated to members of the Board not later than 60 days before the session;
- ii) **took note** of the projected operational requirements of US\$5.4 billion, excluding any provision for unforeseen emergencies and including direct support costs (DSC), as outlined in Section III;
- iii) **approved** a transfer of US\$24.1 million from the Direct Support Cost Advance Facility (DSCAF) to the PSA Equalization Account;
- iv) **noted** that the PSA budget proposal assumed, at a funding level of 90 percent of the above operational requirements, that up to US\$34 million from the PSA Equalization Account may be required to offset any potential funding shortfall;
- v) **approved** a PSA appropriation of US\$345 million for the following purposes:

➤ Programme support: regional and country offices	US\$103.756 million
➤ Programme support: Headquarters	US\$42.692 million
➤ Management and administration	US\$198.552 million
➤ Total	US\$345.000 million
- vi) **approved** expenditures of up to US\$10.6 million funded from the General Fund for the transition to the proposed PSA budget, as outlined in Section IV;
- vii) **approved** expenditures of up to US\$26.6 million funded from the General Fund for the United Nations Department of Safety and Security (UNDSS);
- viii) **approved** an indirect support cost (ISC) recovery rate of 7.0 percent for the 2008–2009 biennium;
- ix) **authorized** the Executive Director to adjust the PSA component of the budget in accordance with any variation in the volume of operational requirements of more than 10 percent from the level outlined in Section III; and
- x) **requested** the Secretariat to update the Management Plan (2008–2009) to reflect any changes arising from the approval of the Strategic Plan (2008–2011) in the session immediately following the adoption of the Strategic Plan.



The Board took note of the comments of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (ACABQ) (WFP/EB.2/2007/5(A,B,C,D,E,F,G,)/2 + Corr.1) and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) Finance Committee (WFP/EB.2/2007/6(A,B,C,D,E,F,G)/3).

2007/EB.2/5 Termination Payments for Service Contract Holders

The Board:

- i) took note of the evolution of the use of contractual tools used by WFP for the recruitment and administration of national field staff;
- ii) took note of the reasons for and conditions affecting termination payments paid to holders of Service Contracts and Special Service Agreements in the field through *ex gratia** payments approved by the Executive Director;
- iii) took note of the payments exceptionally approved by the Executive Director in recent years when emergency and relief operations had undergone major programme reductions under a three- to five-year phased approach; these should be completed by the end of 2007, with the largest operation to be completed by March 2009; the amounts paid to employees on Service Contracts would be reported to the Board on completion of downsizing or office closure;
- iv) took note of the payments exceptionally approved in 2005 by the Executive Director in support of the 2006 staffing review whereby Service Contract and Special Service Agreement holders were either appointed on Fixed Term contracts, as per established criteria, or were terminated; a few countries were still finalizing approved action; and
- v) took note of the development of WFP Service Contracts and the *WFP Special Service Guidelines* in collaboration with United Nations funds and programmes for use by field offices to ensure that a harmonized contractual system was applied and that staffing reviews continued to be undertaken.

The Board approved “Biennial Programme of Work (2008–2009) of the Executive Board” (WFP/EB.2/2007/12-A) as proposed by the Bureau and the Secretariat.

2007/EB.2/32 A Proposal for Handling Succession Planning Issues in the Executive Board Bureau

Having reviewed document WFP/EB.2/2007/12-B on succession planning issues in the Executive Board Bureau, the Board approved the proposed amendments to Rule IV of its Rules of Procedure, which would read as follows:

“Rule IV: Election of the Bureau

1. The Board shall, at its first session of each year, elect from among the representatives of its members a President, a Vice-President and three other members of the Bureau (collectively designated as the Bureau) as well as an alternate.
2. Each member of the Bureau shall be chosen from one of the Lists of States as defined in Appendix A to the General Regulations of WFP. In the election of the President, the Vice-President and the other members of the Bureau, consideration shall be given to the equitable geographical rotation of their offices among the Lists of States.

Each alternate will replace the Bureau member if he/she is temporarily or permanently unavailable. The designated alternate shall have the same rights and responsibilities as the Bureau member he/she is replacing. Alternates may also attend Bureau meetings as non-participating observers at other times.



Notwithstanding the foregoing, if the President becomes temporarily or permanently absent, unavailable, otherwise unable to fulfil the duties of the position or ceases to represent a member of the Board, the following procedure applies:

- i) if the President becomes temporarily unavailable, the Vice-President will take over his functions and responsibilities;
- ii) if the President becomes permanently unavailable, the procedure for replacement will depend on when this occurs;
 - a) if it occurs at or before the Annual Session of the Board, the President will be replaced by the alternate referred to in Rule IV.1 until the end of the period of tenure;
 - b) if it occurs after the Annual Session of the Board, the Vice-President will take over the functions and responsibilities of the outgoing President until the end of the period of tenure.
3. The President of the Board shall not, except in exceptional cases as decided by the Board, be eligible for re-election. The Vice-President and the other members of the Bureau shall be eligible for re-election.”

2007/EB.2/33 Collaboration among the United Nations Rome-Based Agencies

The Board took note of the information provided in “Collaboration among the United Nations Rome-Based Agencies” (WFP/EB.2/2007/12-C) and encouraged WFP to continue to enhance its cooperation with FAO and IFAD in areas that contribute to the achievement of strategic and management objectives approved by the WFP Executive Board.

The Board requested the WFP Secretariat to integrate into the strategic planning process a thorough analysis of the strengths and weaknesses of WFP and the gaps in the international system to address hunger.

The Board urged the WFP Secretariat, subsequent to the strategic planning process, to consult with the Rome-based agencies on undertaking a joint document on the directions that future purpose-driven operational partnerships could take at the global, regional and country levels.
