## **ANNUAL REPORTS**

### **2001/EB.A/2 Annual Report of the Executive Director: 2000**

The Board approved the Annual Report of the Executive Director: 2000 (WFP/EB.A/2001/3, Corr.1 and Corr.2) with the following observations:

The Board supported the Executive Director's strong call for improvements in staff security in all areas, and the Secretary-General's efforts to strengthen the United Nations security system. The Board agreed to take this item up under Other Business, and to delete paragraph 182 b) in the Annual Report on the grounds that it was inappropriate for governments to take different decisions in international fora.

In accordance with its decision 2000/EB.A/2, of 22 May 2000,



the Board requested that the Annual Report be forwarded as amended to the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) and the FAO Council, along with the Board's decisions and recommendations for 2000 and the present decision, in fulfilment of the reporting obligations of the Board under General Regulation VI.3.

## **POLICY ISSUES**

### **2001/EB.A/3 Report on the Implementation of the Enabling Development Policy: From Theory to Practice**

The Board endorsed the report and welcomed the progress in implementing the Enabling Development policy, described in document WFP/EB.A/2001/4-A. It encouraged the Secretariat to continue to implement the policy, taking into account considerations raised during the discussion.

### **2001/EB.A/4 WFP Working with NGOs: A Framework for Partnership**

The Board approved the recommendations on how WFP/NGO partnerships should be pursued, contained in document WFP/EB.A/2001/4-B—prepared in response to a request made by the Board at its First Regular Session, 2000.

Those recommendations are as follows:

- WFP would work in partnership with NGOs, in particular local NGOs, to reach its target populations more effectively when appropriate
- WFP would facilitate government, NGO and WFP tripartite arrangements to the extent feasible as a normal course of action and leading, where possible, to formal agreements.
- WFP would adopt an NGO Partnership Framework that defines the key elements for strengthening partnerships with both international and local NGOs.
- Country offices would plan at the country level for partnerships, developing country-specific partnership arrangements based on the WFP-NGO Partnership Framework. Key planning elements would be summarized and included in the Country Strategy Outline, Country Programme and recovery strategy.
- Country-level partnership planning with NGOs would be consistent with existing WFP policies and approaches to financial accountability and management.
- WFP would support capacity-building with its NGO partners



and WFP staff, within available resources. Capacity-building would focus on food logistics and management (in emergency settings), programme planning and design (including exit strategies), gender assessments, monitoring for results, budgeting, reporting and accountability procedures, as these activities are associated with existing WFP programmes.

- As appropriate, WFP would engage in joint partnership advocacy initiatives on behalf of the hungry poor. The Programme would also facilitate better working relationships among NGOs, governments and donors to secure additional non-food resources in support of WFP programmes. WFP would also commit itself to the timely delivery of agreed-upon food commodities and associated non-food items.
- Formal agreements would define roles and responsibilities but be flexible enough to allow for amendments as circumstances change. WFP would include programmatic roles and responsibilities in NGO Partnership Agreements, in addition to the agreed-upon financial and administrative conditions. These arrangements would be reflected in country-level agreements, or Letters of Understanding, operational contracts, Plans of Operations and NGO Partnership Agreements.
- WFP welcomes partnerships where both partners contribute resources of their own, based on individual capabilities. However, given WFP's strong desire to work with local NGOs and CBOs, the Programme would give priority to international and national NGOs that facilitated local NGO involvement.

WFP would expand the range of partnerships and capacity-building measures with local NGOs, in consultation with governments in beneficiary countries and in conformity with WFP cost structures. WFP encourages donors to support its efforts in meeting capacity-building objectives.

Following the decision of the Executive Board, operational guidelines for planning and implementation of NGO partnership activities would be prepared.

**2001/EB.A/6 Amendments to General Rules VI.1 and X.2(a) of WFP**

The Board approved the following proposed changes made to the General Rules (in document WFP/EB.A/2001/4-D) as follow-up to decision 2000/EB.3/1:

**General Rules VI.1: Strategic Plan**

The Executive Director shall submit to the Annual Session of the Board, in the second year of each financial period, a Strategic Plan that will cover a four-year period, be prepared every two years on a rolling basis and will highlight the main features of the proposed programme of work for the ensuing financial period.

**General Rule X.2: Country Programme for development assistance**

(a) Within the framework of the Strategic Plan, the Executive Director shall submit to the Board for review and approval multi-year country programmes to be undertaken by WFP that are integrated with the development plans and priorities of the recipient countries.

...

In accordance with General Rule XV.1, the Board requested that the above amendments be submitted for information to ECOSOC and the FAO Council.

**2001/EB.A/8 Budgetary Performance Report for 2000**

The Board took note of the Budgetary Performance Report for 2000 (WFP/EB.A/2001/5-A/1), and the comments of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions (ACABQ) and the FAO Finance Committee.



It agreed that the Budgetary Performance Report for 2000 would be the last annual report of its kind submitted by the Programme.

**2001/EB.A/9 Strategic and Financial Plan (2002–2005)**

The Board approved the Strategic and Financial Plan (2002-2005) (WFP/EB.A/2001/5-B/1 and Corr.1). It considered the comments of the ACABQ and the FAO Finance Committee, and requested that, in the Plan's implementation, the Secretariat take into account considerations expressed during the debate.

**2001/EB.A/10 Amendments to the WFP Financial Regulations on the Operational Reserve**

The Board approved, with immediate effect, the revised Financial Regulation 10.6, as follows:

***Proposed Financial Regulation 10.6:***

Drawdowns from the operational reserve shall be restored as soon as possible from the contributions made for the purpose for which the drawdown was made. At the end of each financial period, the Executive Director should determine any such contributions that are uncollectable and for which expenditure was incurred and request the Board to approve the replenishment of the operational reserve from the unearmarked portion of the General Fund. Such requests shall be made at the time of the presentation of the audited biennial accounts.

The Board also considered the comments of the ACABQ and the FAO Finance Committee.

The Board took note of the relevant amendment to Financial Rule 110.1, described in document WFP/EB.A/2001/5-C/1.

It encouraged the Executive Director to continue to advocate, in all suitable fora, for the security of staff. The Board agreed that, until the General Assembly decided otherwise on funding sources for the financing of the United Nations security management system, a fair and effective cost-sharing mechanism should be put in place, as recommended under General Assembly resolution A/55/238.

The Board authorized the Executive Director to assume the required financial commitment, and indicated that it would review the matter in the context of its consideration of the budget, at its Third Regular Session, 2001.
