

Libyan Context

Political

- Recognition by UN Credentials Committee
- UN Security Council: Mission and Lifting Sanctions
- Secretary General-chaired "Friends of Libya" meeting (September 20)

Humanitarian/Recovery

- UN 30-day Humanitarian Action Plan until end September: then 3-month Flash Appeal with early recovery elements
- PCNA (Post Conflict Needs Assessment)
- Immediate funding through unfrozen assets processed through UN Sanctions Committee and NTC project vetting
- Libya Recovery Trust Fund (LRTF) as potential longer-term option



WFP's Strategy in Libya

- Up to 750,000 beneficiary planning figure but flexible response with food assistance for IDPs and vulnerable groups (TCN) which includes a provision for 400,000 in the south
- Cash & Vouchers intervention as focus for initial response and possible safety net modality for any planned phase out of Public Distribution System
- Food Security Cluster (FSC) to coordinate food assistance activities under 30-day humanitarian action plan, including Cash & Vouchers
- Providing longer term technical assistance for safety nets



Critical Risks

Contextual Risks:

- Protracted conflict
- Libya Economic situation
- -State and Commercial resupply
- Lack of quality water, fuel and healthcare

Programmatic Risk:

- Sustainability of size of WFP workforce
- Properly coordinated plans with Govt of Libya
 - Lack of partner / counterpart capacity
 - Securing Humanitarian
 Access
 - Inadequate, late or sporadic Funding

Institutional Risk:

- Staff safety and security
-Inadequate access and resources to fulfill mandate compromising reputation
