

What is El Niño?

El Niño is simply an abnormal warming of the sea surface temperature in the eastern tropical Pacific



- El Niño events occur irregularly but frequently.
 - Their magnitude depends on how warm Pacific ocean waters get.
 - The last two *"very strong"* events were 82-83 and 97-98.
 - 2015/16 El Niño projected to be at the record levels of 1997/98.

Timing of Growing Seasons and El Niño development

Timing of the southern African growing season along with the temporal coverage of seasonal forecasts. The growing season in 2015/16 will develop fully under one of the **strongest events of the past 35 years**.
