Purposes

- To use food aid to support economic and social development
- To meet refugee and other emergency and protracted relief food needs
- To promote world food security in accordance with the recommendations of the United Nations and FAO

Functions

- To aid in economic and social development
 - concentrating on the needlest people and countries;
- To assist in the continuum from emergency relief to development
 - Supporting disaster prevention, preparedness and mitigation and postdisaster rehabilitation activities;
- To assist in meeting refugee and other emergency and protracted relief food needs
 - Serving both relief and development purposes;
- To provide services to bilateral donors, United Nations agencies and NGOs
 - Consistent with the purposes of WFP and which complement WFP's operations.
