REVIEW OF 2010: ACHIEVEMENTS AND CHALLENGES



Increased demand for food assistance, following 2009 drought and insecurity – 9 million beneficiaries reached

Humanitarian crisis averted in Southern Sudan for 4.3 million people

Assistance in Darfur hampered by lack of access and deteriorating security – more than 400,000 people not reached in August

Maximized windows of opportunity to expand safety net programmes and pilot innovation

LOOKING AHEAD: SHIFTING FROM AID TO ASSISTANCE

Help beneficiaries become self-reliant, support rural economy and foster government ownership

DARFUR

- Rationalize beneficiary numbers
- Shift to targeted programmes and assist to develop markets
- Assist returns

SOUTH

- Increase Government capacity, ownership and funding
- Assist to develop rural economy and markets
- Safety Nets

CETA

- Establish Bilateral Food Security programmes
- Handover programmes to GoS

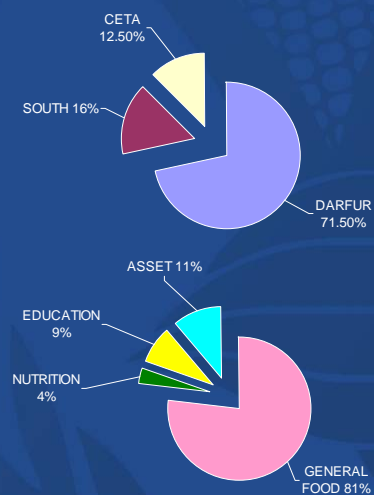
