

Procurement

• 2.8 million MT of food (valued at US\$1.4B) purchased

Shipping

- 40 ships on average on the high seas at any given time.
- Shipped 3.2 Million MT.

Aviation

- 100 aircraft on any given day.
- Airlifted 361,000 pax and 15,000 MT of cargo.

Road Transport

• 5,000+ trucks on the road daily. Handled 4 Million MT.

Infrastructure:

• Building and refurbishing ports, airports, roads, railways & bridges.

Staff:

• 3,000+ Logistics staff worldwide


Providing the platform for an integrated and more predictable response through coordination and collaboration
