


RISING FOOD PRICES PUSHING MILLIONS BELOW THE POVERTY LINE

FOOD BASED INFLATION AFFECTING THE MOST VULNERABLE











NEGATIVE PRECONDITIONS WORSENED BY SOARING FOOD PRICES IN CENTRAL AMERICA

Estimate of number of poor in 2006, 2007 and simulation for 2008




500,000 people in El Salvador & Guatemala, have fallen into poverty and turned new food insecure due to this crisis

EXAMPLES OF COUNTRY-SPECIFIC AND REGIONAL INITIATIVES SUPPORTED BY WFP TO TACKLE SOARING FOOD PRICES (I)

Haiti

- Scaling up programmes using the existing implementation mechanisms and increasing the number of beneficiaries from 800,000 to 2.3 million, staring from May through immediate general food distribution for 200.000 most vulnerable urban populations
- Food rations to additional 1.1 million beneficiaries from vulnerable families through school take-home rations as a safety net to protect households' income and allow them to maintain adequate food consumption and avoid deterioration of their health and nutritional status;
- Providing a daily meal for extracurricular activities during the school break for 200,000 children.
- Preparing an emergency food security assessment (EFSA) and strengthening, together with FAO, the National Coordination for Food Security (CNSA).





EXAMPLES OF COUNTRY-SPECIFIC AND REGIONAL INITIATIVES SUPPORTED BY WFP TO TACKLE SOARING FOOD PRICES (II)

El Salvador

Support in school feeding (procurement, quality control, and programme expansion).

Established SATCA (Central American Early Warning System); Establishing SISVIN (nutritional surveillance in support of Ministry of Health); FSMS - piloting a food security monitoring system in support of Ministry of Agriculture; Vulnerability assessment and mapping (VAM).

Piloting purchases from small farmers; food for work – disaster prevention / mitigation.

Technical assistance in revising the basic food basket and to elaborate and implement an integrated national plan to prevent/ reduce and control micronutrient deficiencies.

Ongoing regional study on markets, prices and food and nutritional security in collaboration with WB, FAO, IFPRI.

Co-organized with SICA, the "Foro Centroamericano - Precios, Mercados y Seguridad Alimentaria" (26-27 May 2008) – sponsored by the WB, IFPRI, USDA, ECLAC, Ministry of Agriculture and PRESANCA) - to facilitate priority identification and policy and programme harmonization.

Possibility of supporting government in complementing cash transfers (Red Solidaria) with nutritional interventions targeting young children at risk.

Guatemala

Supporting farmers to produce maize as input for locally produced fortified blended food "Vitacereal" and facilitating marketing channel between farmers and the industry.

Piloting purchases from small farmers.

Bolstering Government's efforts to address hunger through recently approved UN joint programme in support of the National Strategy to Reduce Chronic Malnutrition.

Monitoring acute malnutrition; refining VAM through focus groups interviews.

School feeding, Food for work – disaster prevention / mitigation.

Technical assistance to elaborate and implement an integrated national plan to prevent/ reduce and control micronutrient deficiencies. Pending funding, possibility of scaling up FFW activities, school feeding and responding to Government's request to assist one third of 93,225 vulnerable families under the "Plan de Atención Coyuntural a la Situation Alimentaria y Nutricional" for 3 months, including "Vitacereal".



EXAMPLES OF COUNTRY-SPECIFIC AND REGIONAL INITIATIVES SUPPORTED BY WFP TO TACKLE SOARING FOOD PRICES (III)

Regional Level

- Since 2005, knowledge sharing, technical assistance and facilitation of South-South and triangular cooperation within the framework of the Regional Initiative "Towards the Eradication of Child Undernutrition in Latin America and the Caribbean".
- National plans to combat child chronic undernutrition approved / being finalizes in all Central American countries, Panama and the Dominican Republic.
- On May 5th 2008 the Vice-President of Guatemala, Ministers and Vice-ministers of Social Development, Health, and Planning and high level technical officials of national health and nutrition programmes of the 33 countries of the region, international and regional experts, representatives of UN agencies and members of civil society met in Santiago de Chile to commit to eradicating child undernutrition.
- The high level event stressed the importance of national social protection programmes as key interventions to protect child nutrition and safeguard the advances already made toward the achievement of the MDGs in the region, specifically in the current context of the global food prices emergency.

Thanks to a very generous response of the donors and the support of the Rome-Based Friends of Haiti Group, since April WFP Haiti has received an additional USD 48 million out of which USD 33 million have been used so far to purchase life-saving food that is expected to arrive between June and August avoiding a pipeline break.
