

Yemen: Fighting Famine



Needs

- 17 million people are food insecure
- WFP target: 7 million severely food insecure
- Close partnerships with FAO and others on Needs assessments

Acute Food Insecurity Phase

- Minimal
- Stressed
- Crisis
- Emergency
- Famine

Area would likely be at least 1 Phase worse without the effects of humanitarian assistance.

External Pressures

- Escalating conflict
- Disruptions to salaries, livelihoods and markets
- Health emergencies
- Competing basic needs



Progress


- **August 2017: Reached 7 million food insecure people with general food assistance**
- **Tripled assistance and doubled number of beneficiaries reached since January 2017**
- **19 Governorates**
- **Currently 50% beneficiaries receiving 100% rations; while others receive 60% rations - due to lack of resources**



Nutrition

- **241,422 malnourished children (88% cure rate)**
- **95,187 acutely malnourished PLW (94% cure rate)**
- **Vulnerability to cholera and disease**
- **Collapsing health service**

2017 Q2: Food Consumption Scores (2016-2017) VS Pre-Assistance
(WFP Beneficiaries Only)



Yemen: Fighting Famine



- **WFP assistance meets about 50% of household food consumed**
- **Borrowing/ purchase on credit**
- **At least 40% of our beneficiaries voluntarily share**
- **100% vs 60% rations**



Cholera

- **Diarrhoea Treatment Centres (priority 30: 1st phase)**
- **Oral Rehydration Points (100 priority: 1st phase)**
- **Logistics (86,370 kg equipment; 258,863 kg drugs)**
- **Emergency Telecommunications (2 national and 21 local Emergency Ops Centres)**



Challenges

- **Escalating conflict**
- **Increased Insecurity**
- **Bureaucratic Impediments**
- **Al Hudayah Port**



Resource Mobilisation

- **2017 contributions: USD 526 million**
- **21 government donors; 2 UN Funds; 8 private sector donors**
- ***Current Needs***
- **6 month shortfall: USD 330 million**
