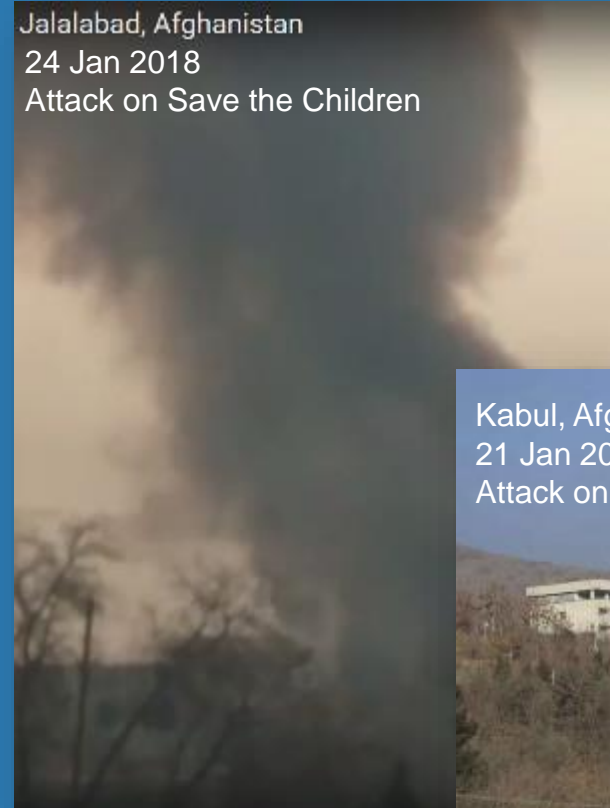

## • Factors

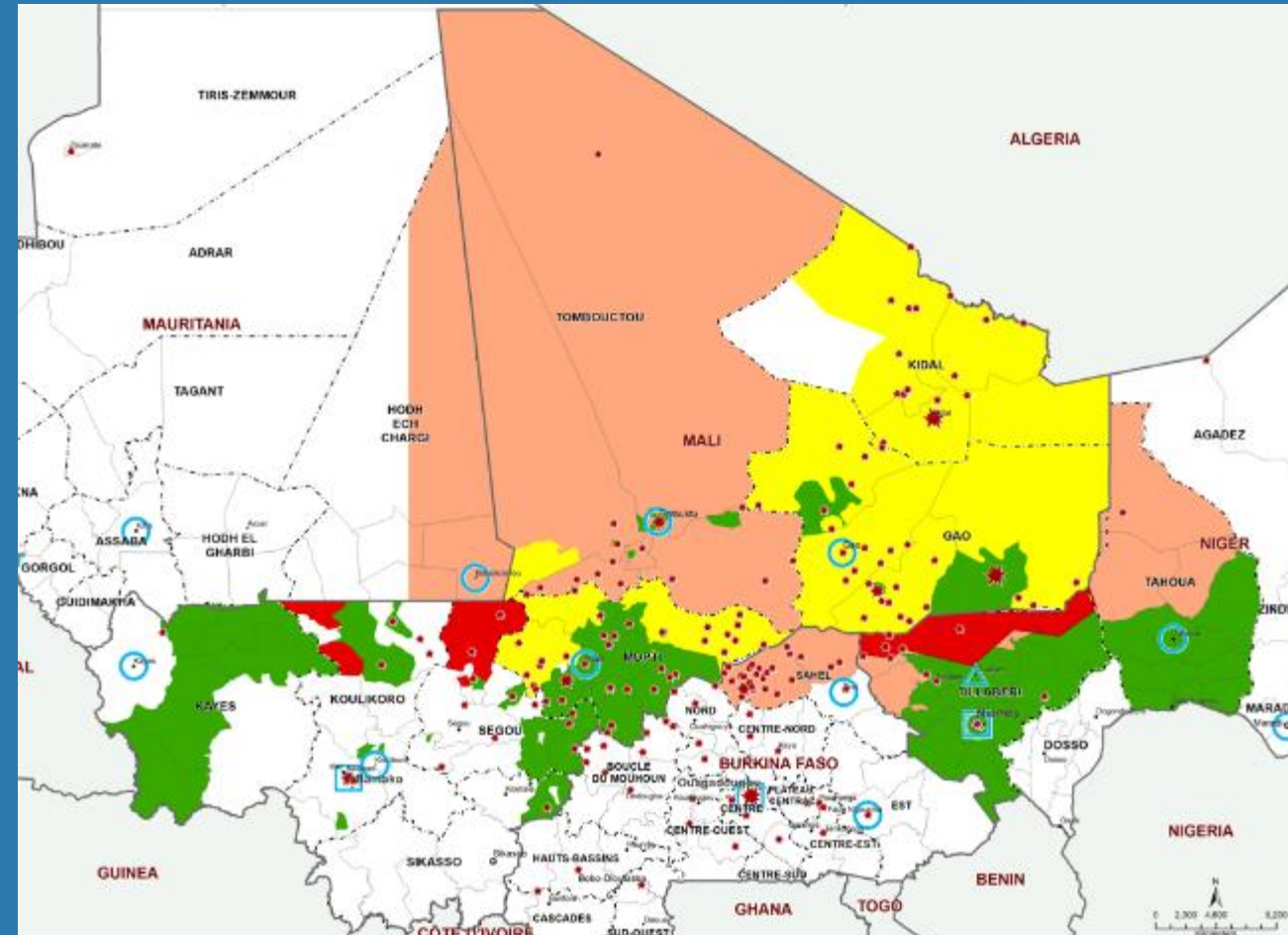
- Multiple security threats and of security actors

- Increased militant activity in security vacuum - Oudalan province in Burkina Faso
- Displacement due to military operations
- Access strategy
- Harmonize SRM on CO level

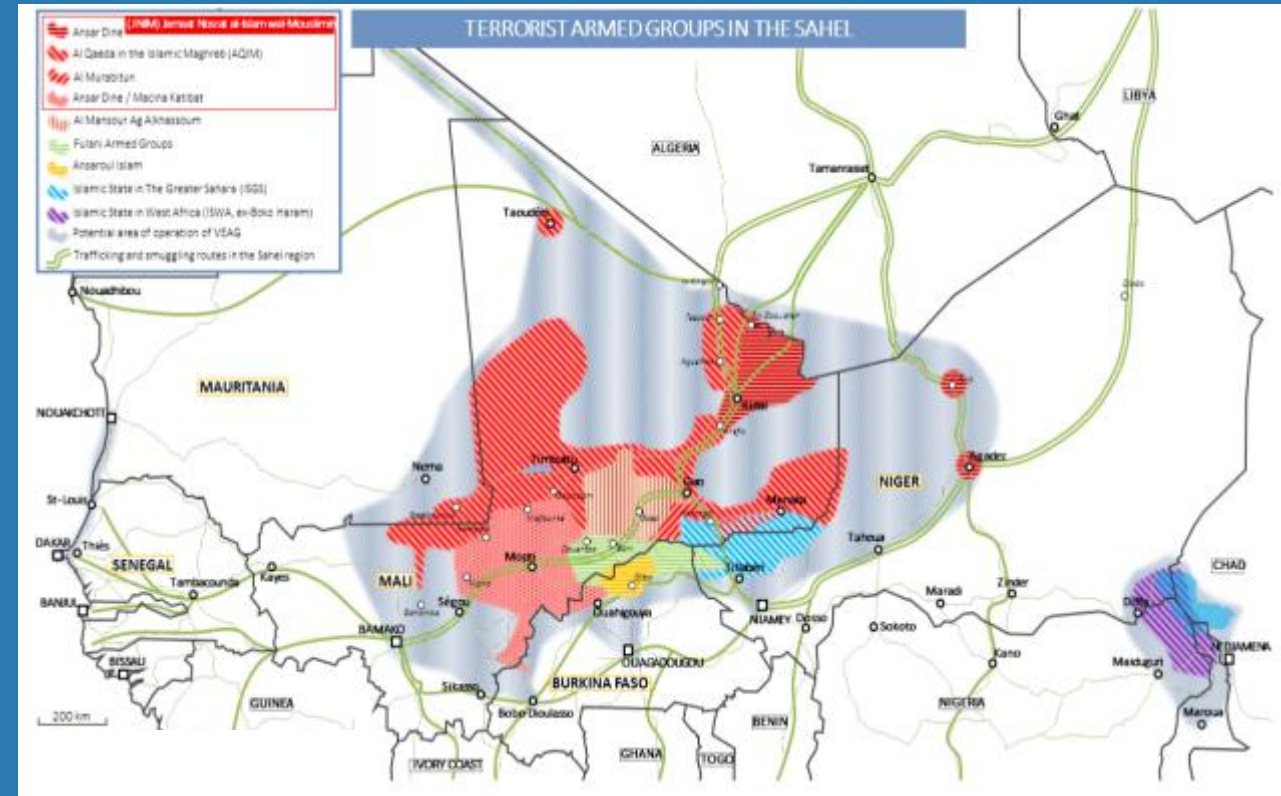
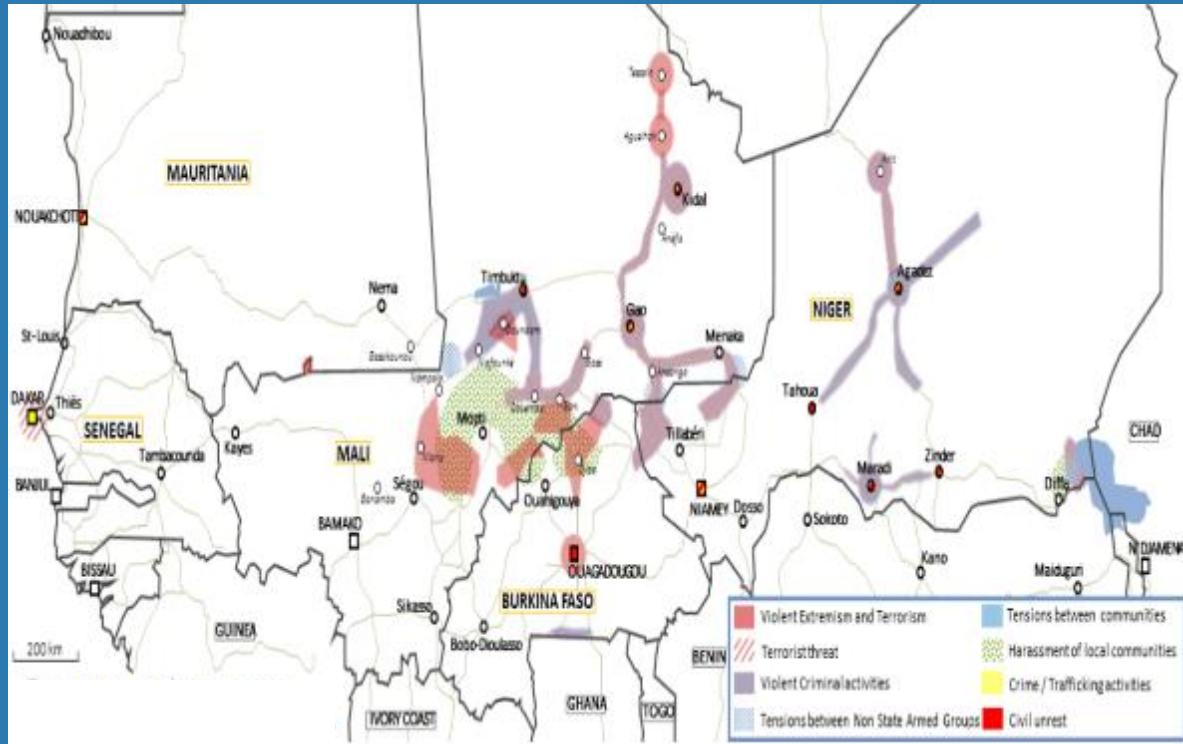

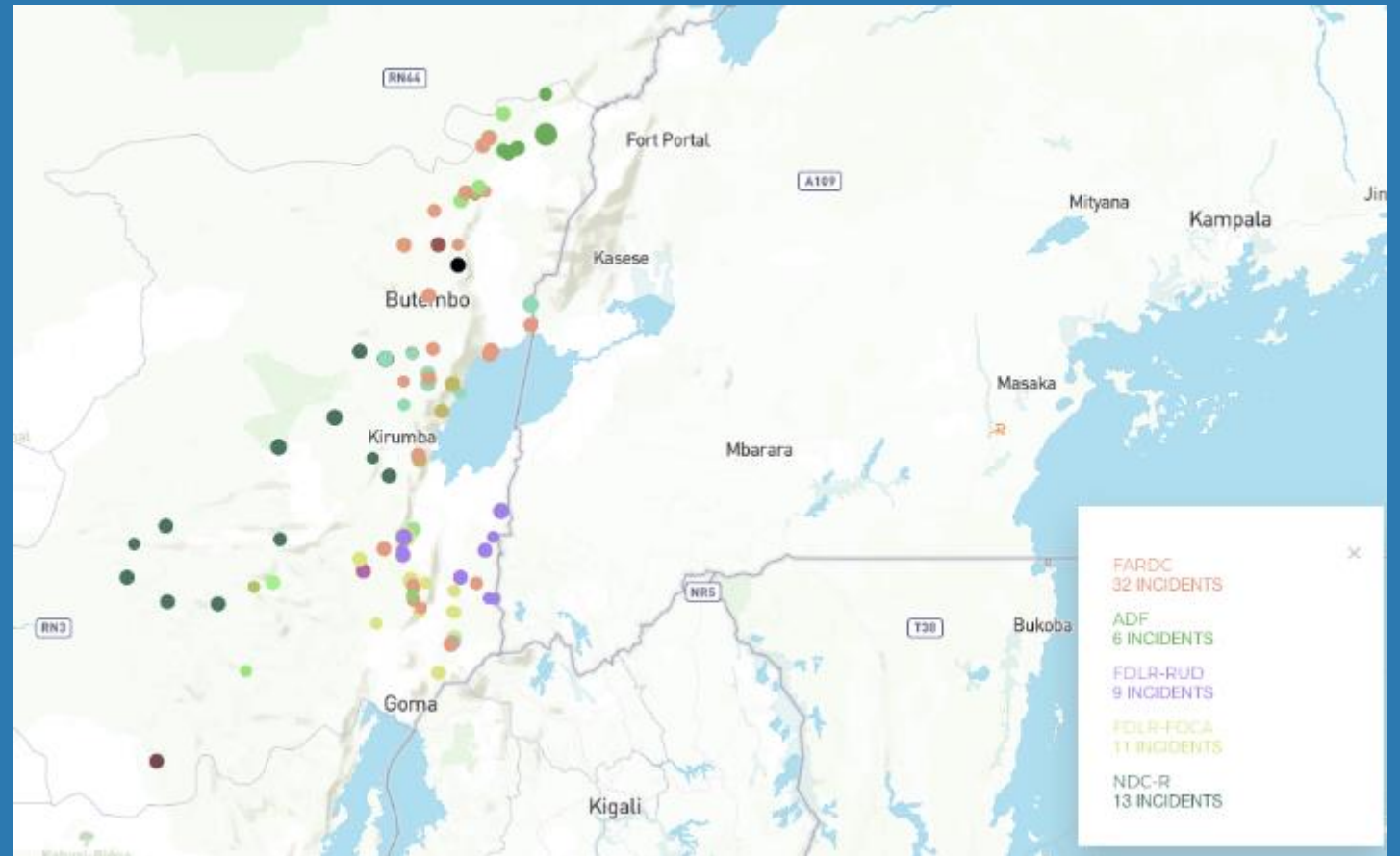

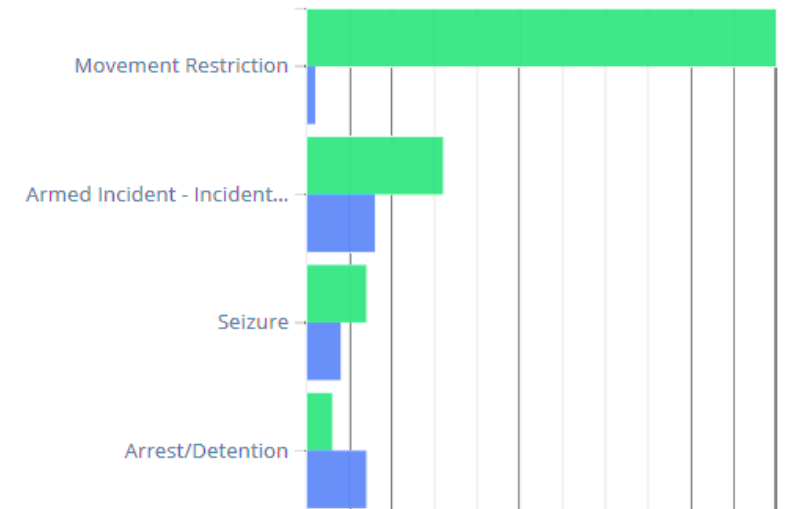
