# NATURE OF THE REVISION

- 1. This is a revision for LTSH only. It will increase LTSH costs by USD 7,421,809.
- 2. The updated LTSH budget includes four new costs:
  - The forwarding agency agreement renewed at the end of May 2014 for one year for Tema, Cotonou and Lomé corridors;
  - > New inland transport contracts renewed at the beginning of the year;
  - > Field level agreements signed for 2014, including the lean season response; and
  - > Increase in warehouse rent for 6,000 mt additional capacity in Niamey.

# JUSTIFICATION FOR THE REVISION

### Summary of existing project activities

3. PRRO 200583 will enhance the resilience of communities in fragile ecosystems. During lean seasons, a targeted safety net will mitigate the effects on lives and livelihoods. Households' access to assets and food will be promoted through land regeneration, water harvesting and local purchases. Safety nets will be extended to prevent malnutrition and provide school feeding; capacity development will be part of all activities.
